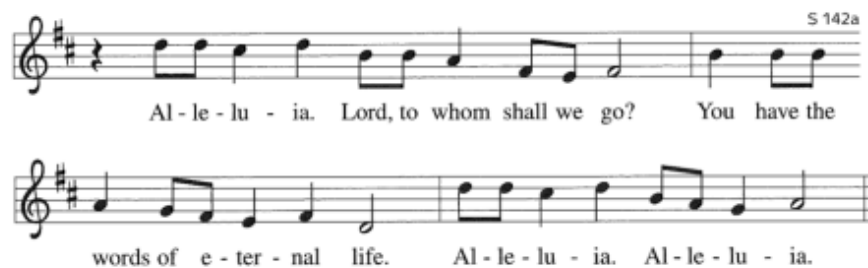
First Reading: Isaiah 9:1-4

The northern tribes of Zebulun and Naphtali experienced the gloom of defeat by Assyrian military forces, but they are assured that their condition will be reversed when God makes a light-filled appearance. The joy they will experience will resemble celebrations of great harvests, because God will deliver them from everything that diminishes or oppresses them.

1 There will be no gloom for those who were in anguish. In the former time the Lord brought into contempt the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in the latter time he will make glorious the way of the sea, the land beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the nations. 2 The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined. 3 You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder. 4 For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian.

SABBATICAL FUNDS: It is so gracious of so many members of Bethlehem Lutheran Church to contribute to the Sabbatical Fund. The Sabbatical Committee is aware there are members who feel very strongly about how they would like to direct their donated funds. Please, write on the memo line of your check what you would like your funds to be designated to, such as Pastor's activities (e.g. special family trip to Holden Village), or Congregational activities only. Any donations which are not marked will be placed in the general Sabbatical fund.

There are a wide variety of costs involved with the Sabbatical, from pulpit supply, extra costs for staff doing some of Pastor's day to day tasks. There are a variety of church activities being planned such as; painting classes, skits, cooking classes, Sundaes on Sunday and many more.

Pastor Paul will be with Bethlehem 12 years in 2023 and he has not had a Sabbatical. Bethlehem developed a policy in 2018 for the Pastor to have a Sabbatical after 7 years of employment. There was a motion made to give Pastor Paul a Sabbatical in the summer of 2023 and it was approved by the Church Council.

The Committee has also reviewed the Sabbatical Policy from the North/West Lower Michigan Synod, which recommends a 3-month Sabbatical every 5 years. According to synod sabbatical recommendations, "although the congregation is not responsible to fund the Pastor's sabbatical activities, parishioners may consider "gifting" as a means of providing financial assistance."
