"...For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit; be like those who are waiting for their master to return from the wedding banquet, so that they may open the door for him as soon as he comes and knocks..."

This is the middle portion of the gospel text for Sunday, August 7th (Luke chapter 12:32-40), and at first glance, there is more than one theme in its message. First is that of verse 34, a continuation of Christ's call in verse 31 before this reading - to "strive first for the kingdom of God" and not material possessions: "for where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Luke 12:34)

But after that, the theme changes to *readiness*...a readiness for God's knock upon our door. This may seem a different sort of readiness than the other "knock" from Luke's text from two weeks ago ("Ask and you shall receive...knock and the door shall be open to you.") After all, this knock is not our *own prayers* this time, but instead *readiness for Christ's arrival in our lives, knocking on our door* - often in the form of a stranger or neighbor in need of our love and friendship. Is there a difference between our prayers and God's kingdom in our hearts and the world around us?

That's why these themes (readiness, prayer, and our true treasure) are less different from each other than we might think. As we look toward August, and the new church/school year that lies quickly ahead, perhaps we hear the voice of Jesus telling us to "be ready"...for all the wonderful, and "disciple-ful" (yes, that's a made-up word!) things in store for us together...

With that in mind, I hope you will join me and the "Discipleship Task Force" (the new nickname for ECD, or Enlivening Christian Discipleship) in making this coming year one of new discovery, as we delve into our faith differently than before: perhaps with more depth or a new type of readiness. First up: The Apprentice Series (application deadline 8/29!), then more in store...

One of the great moments of outreach at this event was welcoming new families to Traverse City. Many were visiting for the festival, but a number of people were new in town too. It was a great opportunity to invite them all to BLC. We may see some of them in worship and hopefully at our VBS Day Camp this month! We capped off our 2016 BLC Days of Service with a community clean-up and one last shift for the parking lot fundraiser. The Community Clean Up events are a great way to see our community in new ways, get to know more people in the community, and take care of creation.

The month then moved into a 3 week series of adult education offerings through the ELCA Practice Discipleship initiative workshops that help us to "wonder" together. And together we wondered about children & youth, through service learning, and about the church. We continue forward in the race prepping for the year ahead and continuing to learn to be church with and for each other.

The Apprenticeship Series is the first big initiative of the Discipleship Task Force (see also the following page), and we really want to see this program thrive! We are looking for 6-8 BLC-ers to join this very structured and well-known inter-denominational small group program. It has a finite beginning and end (September 2016 through November 2017, with a big break over the summer of 2017). Please note: sign-up deadline is this August 29th! Though it requires a commitment of roughly 30 two-hour weeknight time slots over the course of a year and a half, it does have some very helpful flexibility. Several other wellknown congregations in the area are participating with us, and the beauty of this program is that – while you can't "skip" entire sections – to stay on track you can choose to attend a different venue for the same session on a given week if the time slot at another church works better for you. For example, if you've been coming to the Bethlehem time slot on Mondays at 6:15pm, and you just happen to have a conflict on a particular Monday, you can attend the Thursday night session that week at the First Congregational Church. 



In 1885, more than **125 YEARS AGO**, a group of Swedish people gathered in Traverse City, Michigan for the first time to hold organized worship services. On **August 10, 1892**, the Swedish Evangelical Lutheran Church was organized here with 20 communing members and 15 children. Seven years later, our first church building was completed and dedicated on Washington Street.
