"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another..."



That is the famous quote that Jesus tells his followers from John 13:34 (NIV translation). But what is ever MORE interesting to me is the quote immediately following: *"By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."*

Why is that second verse (John 13:35) so important? What is the "this" referring to? It is (because of) the word we so often hear in church, but perhaps do not experience often in the week *days* that follow the week*ends*..."disciples." We as followers of Christ are called to love one another, for the sake of Christ, for the sake of the world, and for the sake of love itself...But for one other reason: so that we will be *known as Jesus' disciples...*Not so that we can boast, my friends, but so that we can serve as examples of love in the world, and sow the seeds of love to grow beyond our lives and efforts.

<u>To be known as disciples</u> takes more effort than merely church attendance, as vital as attendance is for us all. The people we engage with outside of church cannot tell whether or not we attend worship. There is no "attendance sheet" in the break room at our jobs, or on the mailboxes in our front yards. (Thank goodness!) Instead, the "evidence" of our discipleship is far more subtle, far more personal, and far more ordinary and sometimes obvious – in the way we treat one another, even (or especially) with those who may not attend church with us. It's that old adage from that Christian Song hymn: "They'll know we are Christians by our love." Love is a product of discipleship.

This year marks the beginning of our 6th year together as disciples on the journey of ministry at Bethlehem. And to that I say first THANK YOU SO MUCH FOR THE WONDERFUL MEMORIES, GIFTS AND THOUGHTS THESE LAST FEW WEEKS REGARDING OUR 1ST FIVE YEARS TOGETHER!! ⁽²⁾ Meredith and I have truly been blessed to be in your midst – leading, co-leading and following Christ with you.

I hope you join me this year in <u>a new effort of relationship and discipleship</u>: not just because it's the next focus of our shared Vision together. Not just because we have new "Aprentice(s)" of discipleship starting this year. And not just because God's Work Our Hands Weekend (formerly Rally Day weekend) is coming September 10 and 11. But because of something bigger and more amazing: *now that we are hitting our stride together, we can truly begin the relationship building and discipleship that Christ has been calling us to be and do from day one.* By this everyone will know that we are Christ's disciples, if we love one another!

Diaconal Ministry now unified to be Deacon - exploring the intersections of our world and the church together, with the Trinity leading the way.

"For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then



heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him." Romans 8:14-17 NRSV

It is with much joy that I share with you the news of my new rostered leader title 'Deacon Julia.' For many the title 'Diaconal Minister' was hard to remember or to even say, thus I hope that my new title of 'Deacon' will prove to be easier on all of us. This Romans scripture is my favorite explanation of how we have all received a spirit of adoption as children of God. Similarly, through this recent change of title, that occurred officially at the ELCA Church wide Assembly in New Orleans, Louisiana last month, all Diaconal Ministers, Deaconesses, and Associates in Ministry are now under the same umbrella of being referred to as 'Word & Service Ministry' and called Deacons. There are no longer four rosters to remember, but two! We are reminded of this adoption from the same Spirit that is in Jesus as we are adopted into this new title for ministry. No matter our vocational title, we are "heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ."

To further explain this change... At the ELCA Church wide Assembly, that happens every three years, our church modified our governing documents to improve clarity, uplift collegiality, and foster complementary ministries in the ELCA. The work of the ELCA requires every member, each of whom has different calls, skills, and passions, and some of those to lead us in being Church for the sake of the world. The Constitutional changes overwhelmingly passed at the 2016 Church-Wide Assembly confirming two rosters of leadership in the ELCA: Ministers of Word and Sacrament (Pastors) and Ministers of Word & Service (Deacons).

So, what is a Deacon exactly? Ministers of Word and Service are public leaders of this church, grounded in community and rooted in the word of God, who stand in solidarity with the poor and oppressed, proclaim God's love, and commit to innovative service on the frontiers of the Church's outreach ministries. Deacons advocate in prophetic service (diakonia), which invite us to ministries of accompaniment, that equipping all baptized Christians for ministry in God's mission. (Source: Summary of section 7.61.02. Of the ELCA Constitution as adopted).

In the Early Church, the Apostles struggled to distribute food to the poor with fairness and equality. Prayerfully, Church Fathers discerned it appropriate to call Stephen and others with particular skills for such service and administration to be public leaders (deacons) of the Church. Then as now, deacons proclaim God's love by 'waiting on tables, meeting the physical needs of the poor, hungry, sick, the disenfranchised and others living at the margins of society. Ministers of Word and Service of the ELCA continue this work, living in the role of servant leaders, equipping service members of the Body of Christ for accompaniment ministries in the wider world.

Please feel free to ask clarifying questions regarding the ministry of Deacons as we grow with this new title in the days and weeks ahead.






