Finance Report

May 2017	Actual	Budget	Variance
Total Income (note 1)	\$ 26,539	\$ 31,194	\$ (4,655)
Total Expense (note 2)	\$ 31,615	\$ 30,282	\$ 1,333
Over/Under (note 3)	\$ (5,076)	\$ 912	\$ (5,988)

Note 1: Large negative variance in income due to May 2017 only having 4 Sunday's of giving when the budget assumed 5 Sundays.

Note 2: April was a good month for expenses. There were some one time expenses in May that pushed us over budget for the month.

Note 3: Overall not a bad month after you factor in the reduced income due to budget assuming there would be 5 weekends of giving in May, when in fact there were only 4. You can see the full year effect in the YTD table below.

Over/Under (note 1)	\$ 8,539	\$ 2,798	\$ 5,741

Note 1: The good news is YTD actual income less actual expense is positive by \$8,539. When this number is compared against the positive variance of \$2,798 we budgeted thru May 31st, we have an overall positive variance of \$5,741 against budget. These numbers do not reflect the Safe Harbor In/Out donations and expenses.

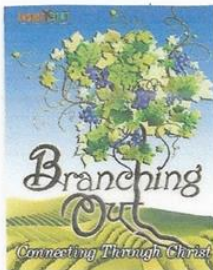


SUNDAY SCHOOL TEACHERS NEEDED!

I do not want to get "in the weeds" on tracking each and every designated dollar from each and every donor...

"The three year Keep Bethlehem Blooming effort has concluded and by any measure it was a significant success. Approx. \$46,000 was contributed.

As noted, our new electronic sign is proclaiming messages of hope to all who pass by, bicycle racks provide a welcome to all, multiple areas of new carpeting are in place, new shades in our Fellowship Hall help tremendously with heating and cooling, the Hearing Loop is delivering the Gospel message clearly to those who needed that assist, the "Caring Table" is sorting our many cheerful giving efforts, pews in the sanctuary have been altered to provide easier wheelchair access, our sanctuary screen and projector are serving us well, the 125th Anniversary tree is in place, the exterior painting is funded, and we have funds carried over to allow a grand piano and other projects like continued organ repairs and Fellowship Hall air conditioning to be supported via the Asset Replacement Fund allocations going forward.

Any unused Keep Bethlehem Blooming funds earmarked for the organ, piano and such are now residing in Asset Replacement awaiting the additional needed funds to pursue those options. If any member made a contribution and wants to know exactly where it was invested or has concerns about holding unused dollars in Asset Replacement, they may ask their question of Bookkeeper Mary Lou Deutsch and she will either provide an answer or seek one from the Council."

These trees possess a special capacity that allows them to outlive others of their species and survive the stresses created by pollution and human activity.

Worship Servants Needed...Please help!

Recently, three BLC members volunteered to be Lectors for our church services. They are an 11-year old, a busy Oncologist and a 95-year old, so if they can volunteer, you can too.

There are many opportunities for our members to be a part of any of BLC's three services. Some are "in front of the congregation" and many are behind the scenes. With more volunteers on the list for each worship team, the rotation could be every 4 – 6 weeks more or less. We also have music teams that could use your voice or musical skills. Please prayerfully consider joining one of these worship/music teams:

Altar Guild: Prepares the altar for worship and Communion (one group of two people per weekend)

Assisting Ministers: Assists the pastor during the worship service and helps serve Communion (one per each of three services)

A/V Team: Sits in the balcony & manages the weekly "Screen announcements" and worship power point presentations (Sat. 5pm/Sun. 11am)

Lectors: Reads the Scripture lessons at worship services (one per each of three services)

Hospitality: Greets people at the door to the Sanctuary and hands out worship folders (groups of two people each for the Sat 5pm and Sun 8:45am services and groups of four people for the Sun 11am service)

Bell Ringers: Rings the BLC bell in the Gathering Space at the beginning of the service (one per each of three services)

Welcome Table: Greets people as they enter the church from the parking lot and assists visitors with the layout of the church (coat room, restrooms, nursery, Fellowship Hall, etc) (one or two per each of three services)

Worship Assembly and Sanctuary Preparation: Assembles the weekly worship folder and prepares the Sanctuary (one group of two people per weekend)

Counters: Counts the weekly offering collection. (Teams of three or four will rotate on a monthly basis)

Adult Choir: Sings at different services each month. Rehearses weekly, except for summer months

Hand Bell Choir: Plays approximately once per month in a Traditional and Modern service. Rehearses weekly, except for summer months

Worship Team: Leads music once a month at the Celebrate! And Modern services. Rehearses weekly, year round

Steel Pans: Plays once a month at various services, mostly during the summer months and Christmas services
