Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The above bible verse from Psalm 96 might seem a peculiar one to pick for the beginning of Lent, but how often do we celebrate our identity as Christians? In Zach Zehnder's Lenten series called the Red Letter Challenge, he speaks about the inspiration for his project to study the words of Christ in a new way: focusing on the call to "be, forgive, serve, give and go" with Jesus – all the while, celebrating what Jesus calls us to embody (grace, love and joy.) This often seems a stark contrast to what many around us - rightly, at times - say they experience Christians being (sometimes judgmental, somber and stingy.) Zehnder helps us to see the life-giving nature of Christ and Christians, with engaging videos, readings and discussions.

This past week we begin our first Wednesday "hybrid Zoom" discussion of the **Red Letter Challenge, to** continue each Wednesday day from 1:30-3pm in the Youth Room and on Zoom. We have <u>25 participants from</u> <u>Bethlehem</u> and several more from our partner Immanuel Lutheran Church in Mt. Pleasant. It's exciting, and a wonderful program. If you were unable to purchase a book at the group rate but would still like to join, by all means you are welcome. Check Amazon for book prices and church emails for Zoom login and details.

Though many of us hope to have actualized a key part of our current vision on February 25th (i.e. Creation Care), it is indeed time to begin looking toward a new visioning and mission-statement process at Bethlehem. We began doing just that in the fall of 2019 and in early 2020. Then, Covid. \otimes But a **new Vision Team leadership** has met already this January, and things are looking good. Co-captains Jodi Kelly and Sherri Helman plan to meet again soon to discuss (1) finding a common resource/s like a book or other materials to begin "pre-reading" and (2) beginning to assemble a team. The hope is to beef up our team and vision building-strategy in the spring and summer, then engage a congregation-level visioning journey this fall. More soon...

On a summer note, we now have three youth/students and two chaperones (myself included) signed up to attend the **National Youth Gathering in New Orleans – July 16 through 20^{th.}** There's also an outside chance we will pick up one more adult leader. We will be teaming up with another youth group and their leaders from Mamrelund Lutheran in Kent City, Michigan. This will allow us to do some unique prep work, relationship-building and collaboration – both before the Gathering and during. We are very excited about all of this!

Finally, we embody this journey together – to the cross and the "open tomb" this Easter. In peace.

Safety and Security Locking the Doors

BLC has started locking the front door during Worship Services for a three month trial. The Safety and Security Committee is asking for volunteers to be in the Gathering Space during services. Also you may leave the Gathering Space to go into the sanctuary for communion or you can choose to have communion at the end of service. (The musicians and people working the audio/visual in the choir loft receive communion right after services.) FINANCIAL NEWS

January income was \$29,711, compared to projected income of \$32,416. We received \$2,704 less than projected. Expenses were \$35,712, compared to a budget of \$36,466. This resulted in spending \$753 less than budgeted. For the month, the church brought in \$6,001 less than we spent.

Year-to-figures are the same as the January figures.

Coffee and Cookies on Sunday: Remember that treats and a hot drink on Sunday are appreciated by all. Please take a moment to sign up to bring cookies or some other tasty treat on the Sunday that works best for you. Or sign up to prepare the coffee. As requested by some of our new members there is a plan in the works to usually have the final Sunday of the month be a time when we join in the Fellowship Hall. Already we have some exceptions...this did not occur in February due to the congregational meeting and also will not in March due to the celebration of Easter. The ELCA works in partnership with the Lutheran Church in Malaysia (LCM) to support the Orang Asli people. The Rev. Daniel Mualip is head pastor for the Orang Asli congregations of LCM. <u>These</u> are the indigenous people of West <u>Maylaysia</u>. Many have been relocated by the government in settlements, which has separated them from the land they once inhabited and their traditional way of life.

They live in a region of jungles and mountains which often keep them from resources they need to build strong livelihoods. Pastor Mualip is excited to use ELCA gifts to find new ways to develop leadership within the community. The gifts will grow their capacity for ministry and reach more people with the gospel.
