But even with many gray days in Feb we generated over 1,000 kwh resulting in a \$395 reduction in the electric bill. And as the sun keeps shining on us, so should the power keep increasing. Blessings as we hopefully "kick the white stuff to the curb" and enjoy new life around us.

FEBRUARY 2025 FINANCIAL NEWS

February income was \$29,039 compared to budgeted income of \$30,043. We received \$1,004 less than budgeted. Expenses were \$41,647 compared to a budget of \$32,488. We spent \$9,159 more than budgeted primarily due to unexpected maintenance expense and annual maintenance agreements of \$10,568 with Temperature Control and Summit Fire Protection. For the month we spent \$12,608 more than we brought in.

Year to date income was \$68,523 compared to budgeted income of \$60,037. We have received \$8,486 more than budgeted. Expenses were \$79,931 compared to a budget of \$69,888. We spent \$10,043 more than budgeted. For the year, the church has spent \$11,408 more than we have brought in.

<u>Dear Bethlehem Family and Friends</u>, I am writing to thank each one of you for your prayers, cards, calls, notes, flowers, and small gifts. I appreciate them so much! It has also been wonderful for the folks who have stepped up and provided transportation to a myriad of doctor appointments. I am improving since my fall in January, but it seems like a slow process. The doctor granted me permission to drive locally and only for short time spans. The frontal lobe of my brain is still healing and it is hoped I will make a full recovery in about three months. From the Fellowship Committee's perspective, that means planning for food and fellowship during this holy season.





The consultation brought together representatives from four ELCA synods and their counterparts in four districts of the ELC-PNG (Evangelical Lutheran Church-Papua New Guinea).

The Northwest Lower Michigan Synod partners with the Papua District of ELC-PNG. They traveled 180 miles west of the capital, Port Moresby, to the literal end of the road.

When [village] residents asked, "Why did you come?" the visitors answered that they had been invited. Upon listening further, they realized that the question was actually "Why did two people - all the way from America - take the time to come here?"

"We were the first of any member of the ELCA to ever visit," said David Hueter, pastor of St. Thomas Lutheran Church, Cheboygan, Mich. "But then, this is what accompaniment is all about ... walking with, listening to and learning from one another. The road was rough. ... I wasn't thrilled with all the cockroaches in our lodging. ...
