Dear brothers and sisters in Christ at Bethlehem,

The above is a verse I try to keep front of mind and heart at all times. In a world that is becoming increasingly transactional and bent on "efficiency" over relationship and stewardship, it reminds me that this planet is not ours to plunder. We have been entrusted to take care of this earth, God's earth, to help and love one another and all that our home contains – not as asset and liability brokers but as important caretakers in a complex web of life. That is a biblical mandate (see also Genesis 1:28 AND Genesis 2:15), and I believe it should inform how we live, love and manage our life journey.

This past month, some Bethlehem leaders and I had the privilege of attending an Earth Day/Week "Energy Open House" held by our cross-town Presbyterian partners on April 23rd. Not only is TC Presbyterian actualizing their own commitment to care for God's creation in awesome ways, but they also gave us a nod for being the first church in Traverse City to install solar panels (TC Presby, I believe, is the second!) Drawing upon their inspiration, there are modeling NEW ways we all can partner more in the future to help save the planet (and save money), one small corner, one small step at a time.

That leads us to another exciting topic: our new <u>"Vision in Action" event on May 18th</u>. Now that we have three main vision areas, we would like to partner with YOU at Bethlehem to put into ACTION:

- 'Social Ministry and Outreach' focus: identifying ways Bethlehem can serve more widely and intentionally in the Traverse City and northern Michigan area/s. This can include activities both onand off-site with the purpose of widening our service, presence and ministry in Christ's name.
- 2. 'New Life Together' focus: identifying ways Bethlehemers can grow deeper in relationship with one another. This could range from structured discipleship (i.e. evening bible study or other interest groups) to much less formal get-togethers (i.e. dinner "pods".)
- 3. 'Creation Care' focus: identifying ways Bethlehem can actively steward God's creation and/or intentionally wander/wonder faithfully in its midst. This includes everything from renewed earth-keeping practices to increased immersion in natural settings in practical and spiritual ways.

On May 18th after worship we will use the coffee hour briefly to inform and invite every member to see how God might be calling us all personally to select one of the above areas of our vision – as future participants or leaders – as we grow forward in our mission/vision together!

March 2025 FINANCIAL NEWS

March income was \$30,577 compared to budgeted income of \$30,118. We received \$459 more than budgeted. Expenses were \$33,517 compared to a budget of \$32,780. We spent \$737 more than budgeted. For the month we spent \$2,940 more than we brought in.

Year to date income was \$99,067 compared to budgeted income of \$90,155. We have received \$8,912 more than budgeted. Expenses were \$113,427 compared to a budget of \$102,688. We spent \$10,739 more than budgeted. For the year, the church has spent \$14,360 more than we have brought in.


Special Field Trip to Archangel Ancient Tree Archive!
