

#### **MAY 2025 FINANCIAL NEWS**

May income was \$23,967 compared to budgeted income of \$29,793. We received \$5,826 less than budgeted. Expenses were \$29,694 compared to a budget of \$32,780. We spent \$3,086 less than budgeted. From a cash flow perspective we spent \$5,727 more than we took in. Lower donations was the primary driver of this shortfall in May. Basement Project income and expense is being tracked separately and not included in monthly or YTD totals.

Year to date income was \$156,024 compared to budgeted income of \$152,241. We have received \$3,783 more than budgeted. Expenses were \$182,321 compared to a budget of \$168,042. We spent \$15,279 more than budgeted. For the year, the church has spent \$11,496 more than we have brought in.

<u>What IS GRIEVING?</u> Could it be the loss of a marriage, your home, or community, good health, a dream or something else? The list can go on and on. No matter the loss you have a family here at Bethlehem that loves you, wants to support you, and be here for you! <u>Chair Yoga:</u> Special Note: the class is taking a few weeks off while Janet, the leader, will be out of the country. Class will return on July 7th. Baby Pantry Appreciation: We recently received an email from Sally Hanley, the director of the Baby Pantry that meets in our Fellowship Hall on the second Thursday of each month. Sally thanked those who volunteered and provided various food items. She also mentioned surveys that were given out. Quote from Sally: "In reviewing the results, I noticed that for the first time in a long time, Food was the major family issue, closely followed by Stress, which is usually the top issue. Having our food pantry in place helps us address this emerging need. Fresh produce and protein were also noted as the 2 most appreciated categories of our food pantry section as well. I liked the idea of emphasizing that children are welcome to come to the pantry with you." Thank you all for your donations to the BLC Food Pantry as some of the items are put on a cart where the Baby Pantry families can pick from. Remember diapers, clothing, paper products and cleaning products among the most appreciated items.

FOOD PANTRY NEWS Finally we are seeing glimpses of Summer. Hopefully it will stick around. The food pantry supplies are running low and could certainly use some donations. When shopping for donations, please consider items with protein like peanut butter, canned ravioli or spaghetti, tuna, and chicken. It would help if you can find cans with the pull-tab opening. The items that we do not need any more of are dried beans, peas, and lentils. Right now we have plenty of soaps but can always use feminine care products. We don't have to worry about items in the pantry freezing any more so anything you donate can be used immediately. Thank you all for your continuing generosity and willingness to serve our community.
