Dear friends,

It is not until later in the year, usually around May, when we typically hear excerpts from the above passage in John's gospel. It comes from "The Good Shepherd" who is Jesus, and the translation I often think of is the one which has Jesus saying, "[my sheep] know the sound of my voice."

Anyone who follows another knows the sound of their voice. It's elemental and basic, yet essential to building trust and relationship. Following a trusted voice transcends the superficial ways we often experience life and communication in today's world. Voices of the shepherds in our lives, especially the voice of Jesus (often experienced through others) draw us together, teach us, comfort us and give us meaning and hope.

The last week of Advent, as we entered into worship with Blue Christmas and later Christmas Eve, our regular sound system began to fade in and out, make crackling noises and ultimately needed to be turned off indefinitely because it was frustrating listeners – both in-person and online. Many of our old sound system's components are 15-20+ years old and in need of attention. For the time being, we are using the portable "outdoor" system we used last summer for outdoor worship, now indoors in the sanctuary. However, since our new livestream equipment is hard-wired into the old sound system for its audio feed, we cannot livestream our worship until the old sound system is fixed. This situation may present us with temporary challenges and a call to be creative and resourceful. We will no doubt reach out to audio experts soon and see what changes or additions we may need to make. In the meantime, we trust in the Lord, listen to one another in old and new ways, and search for ways to be connected.

Finally, the New Year brings with it new joys and opportunities. As we ring in 2022, we hope to begin with new energy and a sense of adventure - casting a new vision for our ministry together, trying new things and being present... We listen to the unmistakable sound of Christ's presence and voice among us... Leading us, guiding us, along the way.

MINUTES TO CHURCH COUCIL MEETING: November 16, 2021

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by Mark McPherson, President at 6:00 p.m.

OPENING PRAYER: Pastor Paul read from Christ in Our Home, "God's Open Door" and from Acts Chapter 14.

ROLL CALL: Gail Goldsmith, Secretary; Maureen Bauer, Denice Bossardet, Pastor Paul Busekist, Scott Farley, Gail Goldsmith, Leonard Graf, Laura Hahn, Jim Hinds, Mark McPherson, Cindy Monroe, Jim Monroe, Paul Wiemerslage.

VISITOR/S OR CONGREGATIONAL COMMENT: no visitors were present.

**APPROVAL OF AGENDA:** Cindy Monroe made the motion to approve the agenda, Maureen Bauer seconded the agenda was approved.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM:** Leonard Graf made the motion to approve the minutes from the October 19, 2021. Cindy Monroe seconded the motion, the minutes were approved.

#### REPORTS:

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Mark McPherson wants to thank the Finance Committee for all of their work on this year's budget. It is such important work to do.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Paul discussed that he had some time away. He went through some files to get organized and was reflective on the time before Covid. He has looked at his list, and wondering how do we get back to normal?

He met with Pastors from the Synod, Sunday Schools are down and struggling with how long and how many services to have. There is fatigue from trying new things. Everyone is in this together.

Pastor is planning the new vision for next year called RediGo.

Advent Theme this year is "Something Old, Something New, Something Blessed and Something Blue". Pastor will be videoing to have "fireside chats" with people each week to discuss blessings, new perspectives, reflect, explore and also grief balanced with hope.

Pastor also discussed the National Youth Gathering in Minneapolis. The gathering is in a stadium and people must be vaccinated. We have 1 student planning on going. Annie is concerned with Covid is such a large crowd. It is possible the youth can go with another group from the area. There will be more discussion.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Leonard Graf announced "good news" the income exceeded the need for October and Year to Date the income is over the need by \$2841.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Jim Monroe reports with help from Tim Fox at Huntington Bank he found out the Loan Forgiveness from the SBA has been in since June 25. So the note with Paid in Full will be generated. So next month's budget should reflect this.

October was a good month as there were 5 Sundays.

Pledged income is coming in at 99% as of October, 73% for Non-ELCA and 85% for the unpledged income.

There are 83 giving units that have their pledges in, 13 giving units that have not turned theirs's in yet. We are doing well with pledges.

COVID-19 update, the numbers continue to climb in Grand Traverse County. Pastor Paul recommends the ropes in the Sanctuary stay as they are, but we may need to take more precautions.

If someone in Worship comes down with COVID, they should contact the church office, it can be anonymous. The information can go out in the church email to notify everyone.

CONSENT CALENDAR: COMMITTEE REPORTS: The committee reports are; Treasurer; Financial Secretary; Financial and Executive Committee report; Christian Care; Fellowship; Membership and Evangelism; Personnel; Property; Stewardship; Worship and Music; Youth/Y2A, Endowment Fund (quarterly); and Sustaining Endowment Memorial Fund (quarterly). All reports are submitted and on file.

#### OLD BUSINESS:

- A. Music position update: The candidate who was interested in the position as Music Director is no longer able to take the position. If anyone know of an interested party, please have them contact Maureen Bauer.
- B. Sunday School/Services Ad Hoc Committee Update: The meetings have been going well. Y2A and Christian Education are looking at combining the 2 committees. They are looking at Sunday School times, especially when 2 services start back up. The children are enjoying time in church with their parents, time in class with their teachers and friends. Duties are assigned at this time through January and will continue until then.
- C. Refresh Committee Update: Refresh will be tabled until January.
- D. Sabbatical Committee Update: At this time a committee has been selected with a Tri-leadership of Carolyn Mann, Pastor Paul Busekist and Gail Goldsmith. The first meeting will be in December
- E. Covid Update: There was a motion made by Cindy Monroe and seconded by Maureen Bauer to have mandatory masks worn in the church if the Rolling 14 day Positivity Rate for Grand Traverse County if at 17.5 or over. The motion carried. Discussion, due to the increased numbers of Covid in Grand Traverse County and Munson Medical Center moving to the Red Level as the hospital numbers are so high the council felt the need to keep everyone safe.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- A. Congregational Meeting: Leonard Graf made the motion to have the Congregational Meeting on December 12, 2021 at 11:15, after Church Service. Denice Bossardet seconded the motion the motion carried. Discussion, the budgets will go out in the mail to the congregation on December 1, 2021.
- B. Building Locks: Maureen Bauer made the motion to have the church locks rekeyed. Denice Bossardet seconded the motion. The motion Carried. Discussion: there are many people with keys to the church and the records of the keys are outdated. This will help to keep the church

- more secure. Someone needing a key will get the paperwork from Rebecca and the Property Committee will review the need and decide who can have a key.
- C. Budget: Cindy Monroe made the motion to adopt the budget with changes discussed in the meeting, Scott Farley seconded the motion, the motion carried. Discussion: the council went over the budget and changed many items. Suggestions to have Music and Worship pay some for tuning the organ. Also to bump up income through renting out some of the building, Star Newsletter advertising. The budget was short, and funds will come from the cash reserve to balance the budget.

**ADJOURNMENT:** Leonard Graf made the motion to adjourn the meeting, Scott Farley seconded, the meeting was adjourned at 8:46 p.m.

# BLC Safe Harbor Supervision Saturday, February 5 to Tuesday 8

As we have over the past 13 hears, BLC will support the Safe Harbor Overnight Emergency Shelter for the period Saturday, February 6 through Tuesday, February 9, 2021, sharing a full week of service with the Northern Lakes Community Church.

This year operations continue in the same mode as last year to minimize the chances of contacting COVID among both guests and volunteers. Last year's safety record was exemplary. Procedures include these provisions:

- Overnight and morning hours will be supervised by Goodwill Inn staff without volunteers.
- Bunk beds are wrapped with transparent sheeting providing sleeping isolation.
- During evening hours guests will lounge in an outside heated tent.
- Evening meals will be served and eaten in 45-minute shifts beginning at 6:15 pm. Guests will pick up their dinner in a container from the kitchen window and eat in a separate interior eating space.
- Morning meals will be provided Central Methodist Church off site.

We will be expected to prepare the dinner meal for at least three evenings; a local community group will provide the Monday meal. Beyond the meal service we will need two evening volunteers (5:30-9:00 pm) and one morning volunteer (6:00-8:30 am). We will begin asking for volunteers and food donations in January.

We ask that you to ponder Jesus' words, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." Please pray that the Safe Harbor ministry will continue in spite of the rising Covid-19 threat and pray for the continuing safety of both volunteers and guests.

### **FINANCIAL NEWS**

November income was \$30,446 compared to budgeted income of \$31,520 for or a shortfall of \$1,074. Expenses were \$31,703 compared to budget of \$33,805 resulted in spending \$2,102 less than budgeted. On a cash basis, expenses exceeded income by \$1.028.

Year to date income was \$326,013 compared to budgeted income of \$347,680 for a shortfall of \$21,245. Expenses were \$324,645 compared to budget of \$349,766 resulted in spending \$25,121 less than budgeted. On a cash basis, income exceeded expenses by \$1,892.




