

MINUTES TO CHURCH COUCIL MEETING: October 19, 2021

CALL TO ORDER: Mark McPherson, President at 6:00 p.m.

OPENING PRAYER: Paul Wiemerslage from the Book of "Job"

ROLL CALL: Gail Goldsmith, Secretary; Maureen Bauer, Denice Bossardet, Pastor Paul Busekist, Scott Farley, Gail Goldsmith, Leonard Graf, Laura Hahn, Jim Hinds, Mark McPherson, Cindy Monroe, Jim Monroe, Paul Wiemerslage.

VISITOR/S OR CONGREGATIONAL COMMENT: none present

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: Cindy Monroe made the motion to approve the agenda with additions, Leonard Graf seconded the motion the motion carried.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM: Leonard Graf made the motion to approve the minutes from September 21, 2021, Cindy Monroe seconded the motion, the motion carried.

REPORTS:

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Mark McPherson discussed running into a fellow Lutheran who had also attended a big youth gathering in San Antonio. Lutheran's tend to find each other in the community. Keep the Faith! He also thanked Pastor Paul for all that he does.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Paul discussed 1.) There have been interviews held for a potential choir director. 2.) Cassidy White is doing a wonderful job as the Media Tech person, however she lost her main job and is looking for the right job for her, staff have given her some suggestions. 3.) Pastor received a Thank You Note from Sally Hanley for allowing the Baby Pantry to use a classroom for their supplies. 4.) We may have a need to advertise the food kiosk, possibly through the Baby Pantry, or Father Fred to let people know it is there. The structure is on the honor system, Jim and Cindy Monroe and Lisa and Paul Schlagle are keeping it stocked. We may need to apply for a grant to keep it stocked. It is difficult to tell how many families are using it. 5.) Pastor has a DVD on Mission Investment funds for grants. 6.) Pastor will be taking off a little time and Pastor Ruth Overdier will preside. 6.) Pastor is taking a course which he started the process on his Renewal.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Leonard Graf reports September \$1600 under budget with nothing outstanding. There was \$264 expenses exceeding income

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: There is no word from Huntington Bank regarding the PPP Loan Forgiveness funds. September is \$3084 under budget to meet the needed monthly expenses. Through September, 41001 contributions are at 94%, 41002 contributions are at 33% of the amount due. This includes pledged and unpledged amounts due. Contributions tend to go up at the end of the year.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE: Scott Farley, Committee Chair reports the Temple Talks went well, the pledge cards are mailed out. October 24th is Pledge Sunday. Pastor Paul and Mark McPherson have placed articles in the Bethlehem Star Newsletter regarding pledging. There was discussion on making

pledges and donations easier to have them on line for those watching Live Stream and Virtual Serves, as well as in person and by mail.

CONSENT CALENDAR: COMMITTEE REPORTS: The committee reports are; Treasurer's report; Financial Secretary's report; Financial and Executive Committee report; Christian Care; Fellowship; Membership and Evangelism; Personnel; Maureen Bauer is looking into vacation time, release time for staff. Property; Stewardship; Worship and Music; Youth/Y2A. All reports are submitted and on file.

OLD BUSINESS:

- A. Sunday school/Services Ad Hoc Committee: the committee is going well. There were 5 children in Sunday School this week. The children are in class for ½ an hour, there is instruction time and the kids are able to be together. There will be more discussion at the November Council meeting.
- B. Music Position update: Maureen Bauer made the motion to hire a candidate for the Choir Director position. Cindy Monroe seconded the motion, the motion carried.
- C. Refresh committee plan: This will be tabled until the first of the year.
- D. Covid Update: Cindy Monroe made the motion to require masks for all participants at the craft show due to COVID numbers, this would be for Vendors and shoppers, vaccinated or unvaccinated. Gail Goldsmith seconded the motion, the motion carried. Discussion there is concern we may lose some vendors. Also we will continue mask protocol for all other church events and services. The ropes in the pews will be more staggered, the Bibles and Hymnals will go back into the pews.
- E. Budget updates: The Council will decide if we will have a balanced budget or a deficit budget. Items to consider, postage has gone up, will there be staff increases this year, can we rent out the classrooms, sell the rental house, and new ideas are needed.

NEW BUSINESS:

- A. Sunday School offering: the offering from Sunday school is added to the general ledger and disbursed. There is a policy on gathering funds and distribution of the funds are decided by the Sunday School.
- B. Naming Sabbatical Committee: Maureen Bauer made the motion to have the following people as the Sabbatical Committee: Maureen Bauer, Tom Rockne, Gail Goldsmith, Cindy Monroe, Pastor Paul Busekist, Barbara Wright, Cindy Monroe seconded the motion the motion carried. Discussion, we will be looking at a Lilly Grant to fund the Sabbatical.
- C. Kitchen Range: Leonard Graf made the motion to accept funds from a donor and the church to purchase a new range for the kitchen. Paul Wiemerslage seconded the motion, the motion carried. Discussion, the stove in not repairable and a donor is willing to replace the range.
- D. Denice Bossardet made the motion to mail a letter to a parishioner requesting the key to the church to be returned and their leadership be discontinued. Scott Farley seconded the motion, the motion carried.

FINANCIAL NEWS

October income was \$35,346 compared to budgeted income of \$31,063 for a gain of \$4,283. Expenses were \$25,319 compared to budget of \$30,130 resulted in spending \$4,811 less than budgeted. On a cash basis, income exceeded expenses by \$10,027.

Year to date income was \$295,566 compared to budgeted income of \$316,161 for a shortfall of \$20,594. Expenses were \$292,726 compared to budget of \$315,961 resulted in spending \$23,235 less than budgeted. On a cash basis, income exceeded expenses by \$2,841.








Advent Reflection on how a Diaconal Practice Transforms, Heals and Reconciles People

Reducing Maternal and Mortality in Madagascar - Remafi



In **Madagascar**, the current infant and maternal mortality rate is 353 per 100,000 live births. The **Malagasy Lutheran Church (MLC)** is helping to work toward the country's goal of reducing that rate to 70 per 100,000.

With support from **ELCA World Hunger**, MLC runs the **Remafi Program**, which connects traditional birth attendants in rural areas with hospitals and clinics. Remafi offers trainings, facilitates collaboration and encourages traditional birth attendants to prepare mothers for hospital births

Dr. Rivosoa Nasoloniaina, a doctoral fellow of the VID Specialized University of Norway, is conducting a case study of Remafi's work. He hopes to understand how this ministry can help decrease the country's mortality rate and contribute to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal of increasing "good health and well-being" for women. He wrote about his research for the Lutheran World Federation blog.


