New Idea for Some New Trees!

Recently the Bethlehem Mission Endowment Fund bought 5 trees for \$500.00 that we planted at the Old Sabin Dam site near the end of Cass Rd.

The trees are about 75 feet from the river and on a bank that is not that steep and they are near the parking lot. They can be seen from the parking lot so they will easy to find. They need to be watered once a week for this summer to get them established and then they will be on their own. They will survive and be a blessing to many, both human and non-human.

IDEA: What if we have 5 people sign up to ADOPT A BLC TREE?

We can call it, "The 5 BUCKET GROUP" Each will get a bucket and they can water their tree any time, either with others or alone. A full 5 gallon bucket of water weighs 42 pounds, so this project is not for everyone.

Refresh Committee Update:

Our Committee would like to thank those who have pledged to help us in our efforts to update the look of our church. We know the economy is presenting challenges for all of us. If you are able to make a pledge, any amount would be welcome. As we discussed during our open meetings, we indicated we would keep the Congregation updated on reaching our \$10,000 goal. As such, here are the current totals:

FINANCIAL NEWS

June income was \$28,157 compared to budgeted income of \$29,454 or a shortfall of \$1,297. Expenses were \$30,048 compared to budget of \$33,999 resulted in spending \$3,951 less than budgeted. On a cash basis expenses exceeded income by \$1,891.

Through June, income was \$174,339 compared to budgeted income of \$181,112 for a shortfall of \$6,772. Expenses were \$183,376 compared to budget of \$184,304 resulted in spending \$928 more than budgeted. On a cash basis expenses have exceeded income by \$9,037.

New YAGM Volunteers!
