
IMPORTANT MOVING UPDATE:

FINANCIAL NEWS

August income was \$26,504 compared to budgeted income of \$29,454 or a shortfall of \$2.950. Expenses were \$32,421 compared to budget of \$30,642 resulted in spending \$1,779 more than budgeted. On a cash basis expenses exceeded income by \$5,917.

Through August, income was \$228,841 compared to budgeted income of \$240,019 for a shortfall of \$11,177. Expenses were \$251,127 compared to budget of \$246,942 resulted in spending \$4,185 more than budgeted. On a cash basis expenses have exceeded income by \$22,286.

"Patients come with a lot more than their illnesses," said **Dr. Victoria Adonicam** of Marangu Lutheran Hospital in the Northern Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania (ELCT). "They come with their lives, their family problems. The process of healing makes me feel like we are healing together." She was able to complete her medical training through an ELCA-funded program of the ELCT that prepared students to serve rural hospitals where doctors are hard to retain. The ELCT health department also operates an extensive homebased care program for recovery and end-of-life care. [ELCA Global Mission Directory]


