Greetings, friends in Christ at Bethlehem:

The above blessing came to mind recently, as I was reflecting upon the times we face together. It first came to mind because of the "full name" we call the Confirmation rite: Affirmation of Baptism. Baptism is the beginning of our lives of faith, and its affirmation later is the time we can put new words to that faith journey. We affirm our baptismal calling after study, communion and conversation with peers and leaders. So first and foremost, we give thanks and **congratulations to our 2020 Confirmands Jane Kurkowski and Quenten Branch,** who publicly professed their faith last weekend on Reformation Sunday. God's peace to you both and continued blessings!

There was a second reason why those baptismal words struck a chord this week. The phrase "moving target" is one pastors and other leaders use a lot these days, because if ever there was an era when we all felt life was a "moving target" it is now, my friends. Questions swirl around us regarding when we can more safely gather, what life will look like when we can, who our nation's future leaders will be, and how will important times like Christmas look for all of us? My favorite answer is something like "God is good, and God will be with us all no matter what." Another answer is: just how that all looks is...well...a moving target.

A search for "moving targets" in the bible came up with some interesting results. None were a "bullseye." Some mentioned the word "target," and some – like the ones in Job – seemed a little less than positive. 1 Timothy 1:5 used the word "goal" instead and was the most encouraging: *"The goal of our instruction is love from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith."* Timothy's verse pointed me to that very same goal/target of confirmation and the heavenly + the Holy Spirit places on our hearts and minds: the seal of and mark of the cross of Christ. Forever.

So, what are some of the "targets" we hope for together in the coming months, and how might we get there?

- <u>Advent nights:</u> We are planning to have Advent Nights online each Wednesday evening for December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, and 23rd, with "Blue Christmas" on Wednesday the 16<sup>th</sup> (see below). We will modify our "2.0" content on Facebook and Youtube online and hope to team up with area churches for this effort.
- <u>Blue Christmas</u> is tentatively *scheduled for the Wednesday night of December 16<sup>th</sup>,* online (and perhaps in-person, watching that service together) with those very same friends in collaboration.
- <u>Christmas Eve:</u> Assuming it is safe enough for us to gather in-person on Christmas Eve, we will likely have three abbreviated services, spread out by 3 or 4 hours (possibly noon, 4pm and 8pm) to allow time for us to "air out" the sanctuary and Fellowship Hall between services. We are also exploring mitigation strategies like relatively *low-cost air purifiers and ionizers* to remove harmful particles from the most used gathering areas like the sanctuary. Regardless of any in-person service, the wheels are already in motion for a special online Christmas Eve worship service, working with Yellow Wood Media, a production company out of Grand Rapids, to enhance our production capabilities for Christmas Eve.

There are other "moving targets" we face together with bold confidence and hope. Please see the next page for more, and may God bless us all in these sacred and wonderful days of Thanksgiving and new life!

#### Minutes from Church Council Meeting September 15, 2020

CALLED TO ORDER: Leonard Graf at 6:04 p.m.

#### **OPENING PRAYER:** Pastor Paul

ROLL CALL: Gail Goldsmith; Phil Anderson, Maureen Bauer, Pastor Paul Busekist, Nancy Downer, Gail Goldsmith, Leonard Graf, Laura Hahn, Mark McPherson, Cindy Monroe, Jim Monroe, Jan Stretlien, Paul Wiemerslage all present.

#### VISITOR/S OR CONGREGATIONAL COMMENT: none

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA: There were a few changes moving the Update on Worship Services from Old Business to New Business and adding D. Giving to schools to support the student's needs with supplies. Mark McPherson made the motion to approve agenda and Maureen Bauer seconded the motion, the motion carried.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES FROM August 11, 2020: Nancy Downer made the motion to approve the minutes, Cindy Monroe, seconded the motion, the motion carried.

#### **REPORTS:**

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Leonard Graf stated he wants to get the Treasurer position filled as soon as possible. He placed the need in the Star, and has asked people personally. Dave Peppler has asked the Finance Committee Members if anyone was interested. He also reminded Committee heads to get their financial needs in as soon as possible.

PASTOR'S REPORT: 1.) Pastor Paul met with 12 churches via Zoom today, only 4 churches have gotten in their buildings or have a plan to get into their churches. BLC is in the middle of the process as many churches don't have a plan. Some churches are terrified to open. 2.) Pastor thanked the Council for the support he receives. As the Pastor, he feels he is responsible for the parishioners' health and it can truly be life and death decisions. 3.) Pastor also stated the Treasurer position is truly needed as soon as possible.

FINACIAL SERCRETARY REPORT: Jim Monroe stated the ELCA giving Pledge is at 91% where is should be. The non-ELCA giving is at 94% where is should be. The Non-Pledge contribution is up by \$2,424 over the budgeted amount. Overall for the year (through August), the contributions are running about 93% of the amount needed to meet the budget. As expected the August income is down, September tends to come back as seen last year. Members are tending to meet their pledges. Statement letters will be going out at the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter so members will know where they stand.

CONSENT CALENDAR: COMMITTEE REPORTS: The committee reports are: Financial Secretary's report, Financial and Executive Committee report, Christian Care Report, Christian Education Report, Membership and Evangelism, Personnel Report, Property Report, Stewardship Report, Worship and Music, Youth/Y2A Report, Fellowship Report, Visions Report, Endowment Fund Report (Quarterly) and Sustaining Endowment Memorial Fund Report (Quarterly). All reports submitted were accepted as submitted.

#### OLD BUSINESS:

A. Treasurer, no one has come forward. Leonard put the position in the Star, and people have been asked, no one is interested. Leonard suggested someone else take the President position and he possibly take the Treasurer position. Council members will continue to invite member for either position.

#### NEW BUSINESS:

- A. Approval of bid by Molon Asphalt, Inc. to repair and seal the parking lot for \$6,051.00. Another bid was received, but Molon Asphalt was the lowest bid and they could get it done this fall. Cindy Monroe made the motion to approve the bid, Jan Stretlien seconded the motion, the motion carried.
- B. Approval of quilting group to use the Fellowship Hall on Tuesday mornings. 6 to 8 women are a part of the group and they will clean up when they are done. The motion carried.
- C. Update on Worship Services. Pastor Paul presented a draft letter to go the congregation, which includes a survey with 3 questions to be returned by September 27<sup>th</sup>. It includes the process of returning into the church building. Mark McPherson included a section from the Stewardship Committee. The survey and the letter includes the names and numbers of the New Normal Workgroup if there are any questions. Funding for Live Stream services need to be looked at for 2021. There may be a possibility for 2 services on Sundays in time, but it will take time and work to get to this point.
- D. Approval of funding to some schools to help purchase supplies. Pastor is planning on purchasing supplies for Blair Elementary school with the Good Samaritan Funds, it was suggest that a noisy offering be taken during worship services. It was decided to hold the noisy offering for 2 weeks and ask the Mission Endowment fund to also match the funds. To increase the schools to purchase supplies for Traverse Heights, possibly Silver Lake Elementary and a Middle School. It will depend on the amount that is collected at the noisy offering. Gail Goldsmith made the motion for the noisy offering, Jan Stretlien seconded the motion and the motion carried.
- E. Funds to repair the organ. Nancy Downer stated the Organ is in need of repairs and updates. Pastor reported this is in the budget and there is a process for funding for the organ repairs and updates.

VISITOR OR CONGREGATIONAL COMMENT: none

GOOD TO THE ORDER: A time for general/undocumented comments by each Council Member if so desired.

LORD'S PRAYER: was said by all.

ADJOURNMENT: Mark McPherson made a motion to adjourn, Nancy Downer seconded the motion, adjourned at 8:10 p.m.

### Finance Update – September Financial Results:

September income came in at \$28,422 compared to our budget of \$32,388. This creates a negative variance of \$3,966 against budget for the month. On the expense side we came in at \$27,154 compared to our budget of \$29,667. This creates a positive variance of \$2,513 against budget. From a cash flow perspective income of \$28,422 exceeded expense of \$27,154 leaving us ahead \$1,268. From a cash flow perspective it was a good month. Comparisons against budget don't mean as much during this year of Covid. Without Sunday services both our income and expense streams are far from normal. A better barometer of how we are doing is to look at cash flow...are we bringing in enough to cover our expenses.

For the first nine months of the year our income was \$272,295 against a budget of \$292,170 leaving us short \$19,875. Our expense was \$271,053 against a budget of \$296,654 leaving us under budget by \$25,601. The good news is income of \$272,295 is almost dead on with expense of \$271,053. Although our income is down, our expenses have also been down allowing us to breakeven from a cash flow perspective. Several one-time repair expenses (e.g., parking lot, shed roof, skylight) are expected to hit in October which will challenge our balance of income and expense.

Of concern is YTD contributions are down \$19,524 from our normal rate of giving. Eventually as the Covid crisis gets under control, the church will return to a more business as usual basis. When that occurs, our expenses will likely return to its historical run rate. When that happens, our income will need to return to its historical level as well.

Budgeting for 2021 is underway. No one knows how Covid will impact income and expense making budgeting difficult. The first cut of the budget was reviewed at the October Council meeting. As is often the case getting to a balanced budget is challenging as income assumptions are contingent on current giving rate and a successful stewardship drive in 4Q20.

**Pecans are ordered but are still available** The Worship and Music committee, with the help of Thrivent, are selling the popular Schermer pecans this Fall. Instead of having a table set up inside the church, we are still taking orders for *Dark Chocolate Pecans, Caramel Cluster Pecans and Cinnamon Glazed Pecans.* The \$12 bags are perfect for holiday or hostess gifts or just plain munching. **Please note that we have less than 10 bags available of the Caramel Cluster Pecans and between 15-20 of the Dark Chocolate Pecans and Cinnamon Glazed Pecans.** Please contact Barbara Oster (231-668-7038 or beo6475@yahoo.com ) if you still want to order.


### Covid-19 Screening Questions Please read each question carefully and answer Yes or No to each


#### STAR delivery

### **WOMEN OF BETHLEHEM - NOVEMBER 2020**

THANKSGIVING is the holiday of peace, the celebration of work and the simple life, a true folk festival that speaks the poetry of the turn of the seasons, the beauty of the seedtime and harvest, the ripe product of the year, and the deep, deep connection of all these things with God. (unknown)

WELCA THANKOFFERING: Life is different this year. Because of the global pandemic, every expression of our women's organization has had to postpone or even cancel meetings and gatherings. Many of us can't gather with our families, let alone with our friends in our circles or congregations as we have always loved to do. It's really hard. But as the Apostle Paul wrote to the believers in Rome so many years ago, "...neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor thing present, nor things to come...nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (8:38-39). And I take that 'anything else in all creation' to include the coronavirus, don't you? Not even a global pandemic can separate us from the love of God in Christ. And to that we say, "Thanks be to God, alleluia, alleluia!" Lutheran women have a time honored way of giving thanks for blessings received - Thankofferings. Some women keep the practice of setting aside daily Thankofferings throughout the year and then holding a Thankoffering service near the end of the year, joining our daily offerings with those of other women throughout our church and throughout our history - and well, it's powerful. In ordinary times some of us may be able to hold Thankoffering services just as we always have and our treasurer gathers up all the offerings given at the Thankoffering service and forwards the total amount to the churchwide expression of Women of the ELCA. But for others of us, things are different this year so we'll be making our 2020 Thankofferings differently.

#### **COVID-19 Brings New Forms of Ministry**

Amid physical distancing and isolation, the diakonia department of the Protestant **Christian Batak Church (HKBP) in Indonesia** has initiated many new forms of ministry outreach.

There are already an estimated 81.87 million smartphone users in Indonesia, roughly a third of its population. Taking advantage of this, one church department has produced materials for YouTube and Facebook and other virtual resources that can be used not just during the pandemic but at other times as well.

Activities online are pastoral care training on Zoom, building awareness of gender-based violence, staging an online art competition for children, providing health care resources, posting video blogs from children and youth, and offering spiritual encouragement through music and song.

According to the Rev. Debora Sinaga, director of the diakonia department, "Many people have been economically affected by the pandemic, in addition to many women and children hit by the violence of the situation." These social media resources give people the opportunity to "freely express their situation."

#### The COVID-19 Crisis – Latin America and Caribbean

Suddenly, a global health crisis has exploded, changing everything. The pandemic has impacted the work of the **Latin America and Caribbean Desk of Global Mission** and the companions as well. Some of our missionaries returned to the United States while others remained in their country of service.

In April and May, Global Mission supported over \$150,000 in emergency requests from companion churches in nine Latin American countries — Brazil, Chile, Cuba, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, Peru and Venezuela. These emergency projects provide food and basic hygiene supplies to support families in poor communities where COVID-19 infection rates are higher and the pandemic has made the economic situation even more precarious. Amid stringent quarantine measures, companion churches have identified responsible ways to deliver basic humanitarian assistance to affected families.

Three leaders of the Augustinian Lutheran Church of Guatemala (ILAG) participated in the EPES International School on popular health education in January. Within weeks of their return to Guatemala, the first cases of COVID-19 began to appear in remote rural areas, but there were no basic educational materials on the virus in the local Indigenous language. Two of the participants were able to find translated materials through the International Mayan League, edited those translations and began distributing those resources in Indigenous communities where the ILAG has a church presence.


