Dear Bethlehem friends,

First, I hope that you all are well, and that you take a moment to check out one of our new online "2.0" worship services, typically "aired" on Wednesday nights, but archived and available always on Facebook or our Real Church Virtual page on Youtube. We have Taize services and one version of Holden Evening Prayer (and soon a **NEW version of Holden** as well!) By the beginning of October, we hope to have a regular online rotation of Taize, two Holden versions, and "virtual hymn/song sings" to help us blend music, scripture and faithful reflection with familiar faces and images from Bethlehem – from home and church alike!

Second, a letter will go out to you all this month to address how we will move forward. Though the date is not official, *our "New Normal Task Force" has recommended that we make our last outdoor worship service the same day as our annual "Blessing of the Animals" (also outside, directly following worship this year) on Sunday, October 4th.* That would make our target date to **re-enter the building for worship Sunday, October 11th.** In the meantime, the task force and Council are working to establish guidelines and preparations to hopefully open our doors once again. But please note: worship will look different, and precautions (like refraining from singing, to stem the spread of virus particles) will likely be in effect indoors for the foreseeable future. REPORTS:

Committee Reports have been received and filed by Christian Care, Membership and Evangelism, Financial Secretary report and graph, Youth/Y2A; Annie Slabaugh; Director of Youth and Outreach.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: No report

PASTOR'S REPORT: 1) Pastor Paul discussed the current Zoom Bible Study is wrapping up Luke and Acts and will be moving into more of a book club format with the book "Paul" by Walter Wangerin Jr. Pastor would like to have members volunteer to lead some of the discussions. 2) Pastor would like to invite people to volunteer to be readers for the live worship outside and also Holden Evening Prayer, Virtual worship service for Wednesday evenings. 3) Wednesday Zoom Fellowship will be in a format of a DJ with Pastor and Annie leading, called WBLC. There is also a Facebook Watch component where participants can type in comments, those on Zoom will be seen on Facebook. 4) Pastor has been working with the Task Force to determine how services will continue after September. This is not to substitute for the live church, but looking at ways to be together when it is prohibitive, such as the pandemic, weather. Looking at new ways to be together, safely. Looking at data not desire, He meets with the Task Force to discuss any changes that will occur. Currently church services will continue as outdoor with the congregation to bring their own chairs and wear masks. If weather cooperates. If they prefer people can sit in their cars and listen through their radio, and continue with the drive up Communion. We have to do what is safe and positive. 5) Pastor Paul stated if anyone is having trouble understanding the need for the virtual and outdoor services, please let him know so he can address it. 6) Pastor Paul also said if anyone has any pastoral needs to please let him know as it is important to meet the congregation's needs at this time. 7) Pastor Paul would like to get together with Mark McPherson to write a letter to the congregation regarding the current funding situation.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Jim Monroe, Financial Secretary provided a report with year to date charts. As of the end of June 2020, 41001 contributions are down by about 4% below the amount expected to meet the budget. Jim stated even though it is below the expectation, due to the circumstances we are doing well.

Phil Anderson clarified the difference between pledges and revenue as the pledges may be higher than the actual giving at this time. Also to keep in mind costs are down due to the building being closed and few activities in the church.

Finance Update – July Financial Results:

July income of \$35,187 exceeded budgeted income of \$31,919 by \$3,268.

July expense of \$36,834 exceeded budgeted expense of \$35,075 by \$1,759.

The good news...if you can call a deficit good news...is July's actual deficit of \$1,647 was lower than the projected budget deficit of \$3,156. This means BLC ended up \$1,509 less in the hole from where we budgeted to be, yet more money went out the door than came in. Contributions were higher than budgeted but not enough to offset expenses.

YTD was a mixed story. Income is \$7,906 lower than budgeted which is a serious concern should the trend continue. YTD expenses are \$20,382 below budget. We budgeted to have a deficit of \$7,512 after 7 months and in reality have a surplus of \$4,964 due to much lower expense over the past seven months. This leaves us \$12,476 ahead of where we budgeted to be. Much of the lower expense level is Covid related (e.g., lower Music & Program Staff salaries, lower custodian expense, property management).

Pecans are coming! Pecans are coming! The Worship and Music committee will sell the popular Schermer pecans again this Fall. Instead of having a table set up inside the church, we will take orders for Dark Chocolate Pecans, Caramel Cluster Pecans and Cinnamon Glazed Pecans. The \$12 bags are perfect for holiday or hostess gifts or just plain munching. We will be ordering at the end of September for delivery at the end of October. So that we know how much to order, please contact Barbara Oster (231-668-7038 or beo6475@yahoo.com) by the end of September.

Due to the unpredictable status of the current COVID-19 virus, the October 10, **2020 Bethlehem Lutheran Art & Craft Show** will not take place this year. Even with the many safety restrictions, we are still not comfortable with social distancing crafters and shoppers need to maintain. With the show being an indoor event, it would be difficult to keep the 50 creative artists/crafters and the many eager shoppers the required distance. Our goal is to not only make the show enjoyable and safe entering our church, but also to make the fundraiser profitable for the crafters who put countless hours into their creations.

The Rev. David R. Rakatonirina, president of the Malagasy Lutheran Church (MLC) succumbed to COVID-19 in July, in Madagascar's capital Antananarivo. He also served on the Lutheran World Federation Council. The MLC has 4 million members. It was founded in 1868. Today it sends missionaries to Bangladesh, Cameroon, Papua New Guinea, Thailand and Tanzania.



The Rev. Stephen Deal has been serving as a missionary and regional representative for the ELCA since 1992, when he began as a catechist and evangelist in Guatemala. Currently, he lives with his wife Marta Girón in Costa Rica where Marta serves in the women's ministry of the Costa Rican Lutheran Church. Stephen says the COVID-19 pandemic has presented a new crisis, one that puts migrants, refugees and asylum-seekers in greater danger. He has spent hours communicating with companions throughout the region to learn how they're coping, how faith communities have been affected and what emergency needs have arisen.

+ Pentecost 17 (Lectionary 26)

Exodus 17:1-17 | Psalm 78:1-4,

12-16 | Philippians 2:1-13 |

Matthew 21:23-32

I will be standing there in front of you on the rock at Horeb. Strike the rock, and water will come out of it, so that the people may drink. Exodus 17:6

As a settler Canadian, I am accustomed to the ready availability of fresh, clean water at any moment on any day. I have also lived in the Himalayas of India where the provision of water was unpredictable day to day, and what was available had to be boiled thoroughly first because it was not safe to drink. Like the Israelites in the desert, I readily grumbled and complained when it was not available. This became a lesson for me in the dangers of the privileges that I had enjoyed and took for granted in Canada. I became acutely aware that the lack of water was a daily reality for millions of people – and that clean water was even more scarce. I also became aware of those who profit from the bottling and selling of a resource that is a necessity of life and a gift of the Creator.

The ongoing protection and sharing of clean water are part of our baptismal vocation to love neighbour as self and to “safeguard the integrity of God’s creation, and respect, sustain and renew the life of the earth.” Just as Moses followed God’s direction in order to offer water to the Israelites in the desert, we are called to partner with those protecting and sharing water. From joining the advocacy of Autumn Peltier, a young Indigenous water protector, to the relief efforts of the Red Cross to our daily habits to conserve and protect water in our community, we are called to share in the provision of God’s gift of water now and for future generations.

Creator of all, stir in us the passion to share the living water of the gospel as we also protect and share the waters of your creation to nourish all creatures. Amen.
