Greetings, and a blessed Lenten season to you all! There are two main things gathering excitement for me this month: the first is our Lenten series "Chosen STILL/s (Snapshots of Salvation)," and the second is sabbatical prep for ALL of us moving forward.

Let's start with Lent, because it is upon us! For the past month or so, I have been watching the amazing and **FREE streaming series about Jesus and his disciples called "The Chosen."** It started with season 1 in 2017, and season 3's finale aired last week. Though I must admit I sometimes cringe at the campiness or narrow interpretations by some Jesus films, this series does an amazing job of maintaining the "authority" of scripture, while using creative license faithfully. A wonderful review of The Chosen by writer Zack James Cole (found at https://www.1517.org/articles/the-chosen-a-review) starts with this thought: "Jesus did not come because we had our act together. He came because we couldn't get our act together." We will lay out the five weeks of Lent as seen in the box below, with a little help from Cole! ©:

The other exciting topic is that of **sabbatical prep for all** of Bethlehem. I say "ALL" because the sabbatical committee, council and I have tried to emphasize that the whole church is invited to DREAM BIG for the time the church and pastor will be away from each other this summer. Generous fundraising by members will allow us to use the approximate goal of \$15,000 raised to be split into thirds, with \$5k spent on covering preaching, presiding and pastoral/administrative coverage; \$5k spent on the pastor's renewal activities with family; and (this could be the most exciting one for Bethlehem) \$5k on funding summer activities for the church that we would not be able to do otherwise (e.g. yoga lessons, cooking/baking lessons, ukulele lessons with Zeke, and so on). Mark your calendars for Sunday, March 19th during worship, as we check in to share status and gather momentum together! Shalom!



January and year to date income was \$29,828 compared to budgeted income of \$29,594 resulted n receiving \$234.00 more than budgeted. Expenses were \$25,166 compared to budget of \$33,308 resulted in spending \$8,142 less than budgeted. On a cash basis income exceeded expenses by \$4,622.

On Jan. 22, Sally Azar became the *first woman* ordained in the **Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land.** Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton participated in the ordination service, along with 18 of the ELCA's synod bishops and leaders.

Jaqueline Canada graduated from Centro Intereclesial de Estudios Teologicos y Sociales (CIEETS: Inter-Ecclesial Center for Theological and Social Studies) in Nicaragua. Jaqueline, 35, leads a congregation in Nicaragua. She spent five years working toward her undergraduate degree at CIEETS, to better serve her faith community. In partnership with the ELCA, CIEETS created a program that offered women students extra guidance as they completed their final projects. Altogether, 15 women completed their degrees.
