### Christ is A...Imost Risen!"

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ at Bethlehem,

As we come upon this most holiest\* of weeks (\*is that a double-positive?!?), Jesus enters Jerusalem in apparent triumph. Yet we know the celebration is short-lived, and the days of Holy Week (especially Maundy Thursday and Good Friday) are as rich in meaning as they are laden with anticipation and heavy emotion. (I appreciate the additional twists Gail adds (below) with references to "Spy Wednesday" and "Holy Saturday.") But perhaps the most compelling aspect of the resurrection for me this year is that it offers new breath, new life, and - yes - a new definition of the Sabbath. Notice how the tomb remains. In other words, the empty tomb is not meant to be filled after the risen Lord departs. But too often we feel we have to fill the empty spaces, don't we? We often take the new space we are given (in our hearts, schedules, and conversational space) to guickly fill it with content.

But the empty tomb might just be symbolic for more than just the absence of Jesus, and the conquering of death. Perhaps the vacant tomb is like the "God-sized hole" we feel after something momentous and unexpected happens. Maybe...just maybe...the tomb is meant to stay empty, for a while. When we read the first Creation story in Genesis, we hear God cap each day ("and God saw that it was good") and wrap up the week ("and on the seventh day, God rested.") The second creation story is the life and new life of Jesus (2 Cor 5:17). How often do we reflect upon the goodness of each day? Do we give God a chance to be in the spaces left open in our hearts? Trained by a world that focuses on doing, acquiring, and becoming...do we spend time just being?

Shortly after this month, Bethlehem and my family will all go on sabbatical, a three-month "gap" where we can reflect on the resurrection and maybe less upon where we are going (there will be time for that later.) Instead, how might we reflect on how we got here and whether we are living fully into the present. This could be a time to see what God has been and done for us. In the next page, Gail speaks as co-chair of the Sabbatical Planning Team, identifying all the activities BLC is invited to partake in this upcoming summer as we "sabbath" side-by-side.

As for my family and me, we will attempt to "BE" more than "DO" this summer. Yes, we will have some important trips – mostly small jaunts to Beaver Island and Illinois to spend time with friends and family...hopefully sneaking in a larger trip to Buffalo and Canada in July. But the sabbatical for us will be just as much about finding time to journal, hike, pray and be present to one another...perhaps attending to small tasks or hobbies around the house and locally that we simply never could find the time to do before. I don't want to bore you with all the details, but I have lists of areas to focus upon along with built-in time to focus on absolutely nothing but thankfulness! There are entire rooms I have always wanted to purge and organize, but…well, life always seemed to get in the way! ©

Lastly, I want to say thank you. To Bethlehem, to my family and loved ones, and to the risen Lord. (With a "timereleased" Alleluia! on April 9th!) Shalom and be well!

### **FINANCIAL NEWS**

February income was \$23,880 compared to budgeted income of \$30,119 resulting in receiving \$6,236 less than budgeted. Expenses were \$29,405 compared to budget of \$31,704 resulting in spending in \$2,299 less than budgeted. On a cash basis expenses exceeded income by \$5,522.

Year to date income was \$53,711 compared to budgeted income of \$59,713 resulting in receiving \$6,002 less than budgeted. Expenses were \$54,571 compared to budget of \$65,426 resulting in spending \$10,855 less than budgeted. On a cash basis expenses exceeded income by \$859.

During 2021, the BLC Mission Endowment Fund Committee has worked hard to follow its mission of funding projects on a local and global level. Using only profits on our investments, more than \$18,000 was disbursed to many organizations in support of our mission, including:
