Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

This month I pray specifically that the Holy Spirit might ignite something wonderful, positive and transformative in our re-newed journey together. For we know that Paul echoes the words of Jesus (Matthew 19:26) when he says that "with God all things are possible." (Philippians 4:13)

FINANCIAL NEWS

July income was \$31,856.80 compared to budgeted income of \$29,319.00 resulting in receiving \$2,537.80 more than budgeted. Expenses were \$35,786.63 compared to budget of \$31,058.06 resulting in spending \$4,728.57 more than budgeted. On a cash basis, expenses exceeded income by \$3,929.83.

Year to date income was \$213,244.76 compared to budgeted income of \$213,238.00 resulting in receiving \$6.76 more than budgeted. Expenses were \$225,675.76 compared to budget of \$225,450.86 resulting in spending \$224.90 more than budgeted. On a cash basis, expenses exceeded income by \$12,431.00.
