Fact Sheet for Solar Possibilities at Bethlehem

- Our new boiler cost ~\$32,500. Solar panels could cost even less and <u>save</u> BLC money for decades.
- New sloped roofs (over sanctuary, FH), if bought *without* solar incentives, would cost approx. \$110,000.
- New roofs, if Fellowship Hall (FH) roof is bought w/a solar rebate, could cost ~ \$97,000 (\$13k saved)
- Only if the panels are Direct Purchased (DP) or DP w/borrowed funds can we get a FH roof rebate.
- <u>Electric bill savings</u>: though there are three different options for investing in panels through Solar Faithful, the Solar Subcommittee strongly recommends the second option, which requires a net investment of as low as \$30,000, yielding more than \$100,000 in NET energy savings over the next 25 years or more. (See separate sheet from Solar Faithful for details.)
- Current proceeds from house sale on Peninsula are \$305k, held in a fully liquid, interest-bearing money market account. Even after purchasing a new boiler (\$32,500) and roofs (~97,000) we'd have enough liquidity to purchase a solar array outright, receiving 30-40% rebates, OR finance w/a loan.

Some of the Q and A Council asked Rob Rafson from Solar Faithful at their 12/19/23 mtg:

Q1. Will the Bethlehem Fellowship Hall (FH) roof withstand the added weight of solar panels?

A1. Yes. The average pound per square foot load of a northern Michigan roof (beyond the roof shingles themselves) is at least 60lbs/square foot. Solar panels only add a weight of about 2.5 lb/sqft.

Q2. The roof we want to install has a 40-year-rated shingle. What is the average lifespan of a solar panel?

A2. The actual lifespan of both a high quality new roof and the panels can be as long as 40+ years, not the standard 25 often listed for either. For "Tier 2" (high quality) panels, panel efficiency degradation is roughly one-half of one-percent per year or about 12.5% after 25 years. So, even if you count for some degradation of equipment with a very conservative estimate, the "savings above investment" will likely be far greater than \$100-110k after 25 years, with panels functioning above 85% efficiency even after the 25-yr mark.

Q3. Does Bethlehem have a straightforward building and roof setup for panel usage?

A3. Yes, Bethlehem has in many ways <u>an ideal setup for a solar array</u> with a roughly 15-20-degree southfacing roof of the Fellowship Hall (max. efficiency directional placement and slope) and a short distance from the roof to the main circuit box in the boiler room below for wiring.

Q4. Would a "Direct Purchase (using borrowed funds)" plan be tied to a mortgage for Bethlehem?

A4. No, any borrowed funds (if we chose to finance through Solar Faithful) would be leveraged only against the materials of the solar array and inverter setup, not via mortgage lien against our church property.

Q5. Are there other churches in Michigan who have installed this type of setup with whom we can speak about their experience?

A5. Yes, there are several. Rob Rafson has provided contact information for the Solar Faithful install sites, and all three of the sites already contacted have positive stories, to be shared at Feb. 11 Q& A or sooner.

Q6. Is now a good time to do this roof/solar upgrade?

A6. Yes. Bethlehem needs a new roof, and incentives for combined roofing/solar installs have never been better. Large-scale government incentives for petroleum-based and other/older sources of energy have been provided at the state and national levels for nearly a century. A 30-40% rebate on both panels AND roofs is new, and there is no guarantee that next years' leaders will keep incentives the way they are. In order to get the full rebates on panels and the Fellowship Hall roof, both would need to be installed within months of each other, preferably within the same calendar year, according to Solar Faithful.

So, that last page was the DATA...What is the STORY?

In 2012 Bethlehem created its 10+ year vision with 5 vision focus areas: **Y2A** (Youth and Youth Adult) Ministry was the first, followed by a "Vibrant and Inspiring Experience of Worship" or (**VIEW**). To both those areas, BLC gave significant attention and financial resources, as well the third and fourth (Enlivening Christian Discipleship and Campus at the Crossroads.) Yet the one 2012 vision area where Bethlehem has not yet been able to dedicate the same resources thus far has been the fifth: **"Creation Care and Outdoor Ministry."**

We as a "Solar Subcommittee" believe now is our chance to actualize that final vision area in a way that both demonstrates to members and visitors alike that WE DO CARE about the earth and the legacy we leave our grand/children AND we are demonstrating a sound financial investment for and by the church. And while the

first 30% of the green energy rebates is guaranteed, the second 10% (of the 40% shown to the right) is essentially firstcome, first-serve. That is why we encourage Bethlehem to consider this sooner than later.

Simply put: at a time when BLC needs a new roof, this roofand-solar project could save more than any other capital improvement or financial investment we could make.

It's exciting. Solar works. It helps when people are in the building and when they are not. And it helps us, and our neighbors. We hope you can join us on February 11th after worship for a Question and Answer (Q & A) with the team and Rob Rafson from Solar Faithful. And as we hope to move toward a congregational vote for this on February 25th, we prayerfully ask that you consider what the Solar Subcommittee and Solar Faithful have been working on...a way to partake in good stewardship and Creation Care for our sliver of the world, right here at home!

Solar Project Proposal – Bethlehem Lutheran Church

Solar Faithful is proposing the development of a 23 kilowatt (kW) solar system with roof. There are two options: Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) or Direct Purchase.

SPECIAL MEETINGS IN FEBRUARY:

During the budget meeting it was mentioned that the congregation would like more information on the proposal for solar panels on the fellowship roof, and would like the privilege to vote on taking this step. For these reasons there will be 2 meetings on Sundays in Feb. <u>The first will be informational on Feb 11.</u> We will have a chance to hear directly via ZOOM from the leader of the company who has led other congregations in this new venture. Since it will be right after church and on Super Bowl Sunday we will have some tasty hot soups for you to enjoy...nourishment for the tummy and for the mind. And don't worry...you'll be home in plenty of time for the 6:30 kick-off. Two weeks after that, on <u>Feb 25</u>, we will have a congregational meeting to determine if we will go forward with the panels. We hope as many of you as possible can attend and voice your opinion and vote.

FOR BOTH OF THE MEETINGS THERE IS ONE NEW REQUEST. TO STREAMLINE THE MEETINGS WE WILL SET UP MICROPHONES ON STANDS AND YOU WILL BE ASKED TO COME FORWARD TO THE MIC. (A lot of time is lost while someone is walking a mike between members.) If you have mobility problems that day, please alert the hospitality team so a mike can be brought to you.

<u>Changes In Church Security</u>: In an attempt to be proactive, not reactive, the Church Council has approved a trial of 90 days to lock the church doors 10 minutes after church services begin. <u>This will begin on Sunday, February 4th</u>. We will be asking congregation members to volunteer to be in the Gathering Space to let late comers into the church.

The Safety and Security Committee have contacted over a dozen churches in the Traverse City area. All of them report feeling vulnerable and are increasing their safety measures during services. Our cameras will allow the person in the Gathering space to monitor and take action if a situation arises. We also have an outside buzzer to alert someone that someone wishes to come into the church.

Safety and Security, in addition to council, staff members and interested parties, have participated in the Active Shooter Presentation by Officer Mike Makowski from the Grand Traverse Sheriff Department. He also conducted a walk through our church to give us advice on a plan for our church. His biggest advice to all is to Run-Hide-Fight if an intruder would enter our church. Remember to:

- LEAVE YOUR BELONGINGS
- · IF YOU HAVE A CELL PHONE ON YOU, SILENCE IT.
 - DO NOT CALL 911 AS THERE ARE DESIGNATED PEOPLE TO DO THIS.

Our community is vulnerable to attacks. No matter where you are, be aware of your surroundings, who may be around you, exits, what you can use to protect yourself in case of an emergency. We want everyone to be safe in our church and in our community. Blessings to you all!

FINANCIAL NEWS

December income was \$39,681, compared to projected income of \$31,832. We received \$7,849 more than projected. Expenses were \$30,906, compared to a budget of \$31,193. This resulted in spending \$286 less than budgeted. For the month, the church brought in \$8,774 more than we spent.

Year-to-date income is \$386,250, compared to projected income of \$364,452. This resulted in the church receiving \$21,798 more than projected. Expenses were \$395,652, compared to a budget of \$388,785. We have spent \$6,867 more/less than budgeted. For the year, the church has spent \$9,401 more than we brought in.

<u>Giving Statements Available</u>: Your individual giving statements will be available in your mailbox in the Narthex beginning Sunday January 28, 2024. The statement covers giving from January 1st through December 31, 2023. Please pick them up at your convenience. To save on postage, I will mail out the ones not picked up by the end of March 2023. Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)

QCD's have been around for several years and provide a unique opportunity for those with a traditional IRA(s) and wish to make their charitable dollars go farther. Any person 701/2 years old during 2024 can reduce their taxes using QCD's. For individuals age 73 and above QCD's may count towards their IRA Required Minimum Distribution (RMD).

Here's an example of how this works. Assume you withdraw \$10,000 from your IRA and your tax rate is 22% resulting in tax due of \$2,200. If you donate \$2,400 to Bethlehem Church you can make that donation direct from your IRA and that becomes a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). For tax purposes, the QCD amount can be deducted from the IRA withdrawal amount leaving taxable income of \$7,600 which yields a tax savings of \$528 as show below.

	Non-QCD	With QCD
IRA Withdrawal	\$10,000	\$10,000
Non-taxable QCD		2,400
Taxable Income	\$10,000	\$7,600

In this example, you could make a QCD of \$2,928 (\$2,400 + \$528} to BLC without any impact on your taxes when compared to the Non-QCD alternative.

The additional \$528 allows you to increase your giving to BLC's general budget or the Mission Endowment Fund or the Sustaining Endowment Memorial Fund. This example was simplified to demonstrate how you can reduce your taxes and give more to BLC that would otherwise be paid in taxes. You should consult a tax/financial advisor or your IRA manager or search the web for helpful articles regarding QCD's. One final consideration. The standard deduction on tax returns for a couple now exceeds \$29,000. Many no longer qualify to itemize deductions on their tax returns and therefore do not enjoy any benefit from charitable donations. Using QCD's is a method to effectively save on taxes and perhaps enable you to increase your charitable contributions.

Global Links - United States New Program Across the ELCA. *Living Lutheran* digital explains . . .

Centuries after colonial models of education were first forced on Indigenous people in North America, their effects are still keenly felt. Western theological education has remained the default methodology within the church, including the ELCA. This fall, Native leaders from across the ELCA, in partnership with leaders from Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary (PLTS) of California Lutheran University in Berkeley, are seeking to change that with the launch of the Theological Education for Indigenous Leaders (TEIL) program.

"The TEIL program is a historic and first-of-its-kind opportunity for Indigenous leaders and for our church," said Vance Blackfox, ELCA director of Indigenous Ministries and Tribal Relations. "It gives students an opportunity to access education and leadership development—and possibly become ordained—so that they might be even more effective leaders in their communities and congregations."

"Ninety percent of our instructors, whom we call wisdom keepers, are Indigenous, and the students will experience Indigenous pedagogy, or ways of learning about ministry and biblical studies, that are not offered anywhere else in our church," said Blackfox, a citizen of the Cherokee Nation.
