¹⁹Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.*

- Jesus of Nazareth, Matthew 28:19-20 (NRSV)



“Go therefore and make disciples...” I am struck by the first word of this favorite passage at the very end of Matthew’s gospel: Go.

Going is the last thing Jesus asks (ahem, *tells!*) us to do at the end of Matthew’s story. Going is also the last topic/theme from our Lenten **Red Letter Challenge**. Going is taking the Word and making it heard, and sharing how God has transformed our lives. And Going is taking the time to do what many of us Lutherans awkwardly (and politely!) shy away from: telling the story. True, we love to sing the old hymn “I Love Tell the Story” (ELW 661). And we might deem it safe to share that story among friends. **But what is it about evangelizing that makes us so uncomfortable?** I stumbled upon a blog called “Eighth Day Strategies” which posted an editorial called “Evangelism? We Don't Do That. We're (Lutheran, or Presbyterian, or Episcopal, or...)” Here’s what that writer says about “telling the story” as a member of a “mainline” denomination like our own:

“[As Lutherans merging together in the past century into one large denomination,] joining the mainline was the beginning of not sharing our faith. It is true for all mainline traditions. The word “mainline” came from Philadelphia where well to do people could live in neighborhoods well served by the best trains (the “main lines”). Well to do people lived in these communities and formed well to do congregations. In some ways “mainline” is synonymous with [people “of means” who were the “in crowd,” so to speak...] These churches didn’t do evangelism. They simply stood proud and were open to all who wanted to join them to come and be a part of the success they shared. It was a circular system. Joining a mainline church gave the member status. Joining a mainline church made the church stronger. Everybody wins.”

To be fair, I’m a tad more hopeful in the near term for mainline denominations like ours and our neighbors. Yet I agree that with the implication that we don’t really “win” in the gospel when we shy away from telling our faith story and God’s story. Instead, our silence encourages us all to become more timid in faith and our outreach to the world or the person sitting next to us. Starting this month, Bethlehem begins building a new Visioning Team that may soon invite us all to explore together what’s on the horizon, and how we might tell the story differently. Join us, beyond the cross of Holy Week and the open Easter tomb, as we discover who and what meets us on the road ahead, and what opportunities we might have to share... today and always. In peace...

FINANCIAL NEWS

February income was \$25,179, compared to projected income of \$28,841. We received \$3,661 less than projected. Expenses were \$29,716, compared to a budget of \$35,948. This resulted in spending \$6,231 less than budgeted. For the month, the church brought in \$4,537 less than we spent.

Year-to-date income is \$55,840, compared to projected income of \$57,757. This resulted in the church receiving \$1,916 less than projected. Expenses were \$65,255, compared to a budget of \$72,414. We have spent \$7,158 less than budgeted. For the year, the church has spent \$9,414 more than we brought in.



Coffee and Cookies on Sunday: Remember that treats and a hot drink on Sunday are appreciated by all. Or sign up to prepare the coffee to give our loyal volunteer Mary Ann Tanis a day off. 

Sumud: For Justice in Palestine and Israel. *Sumud* is an Arabic word meaning “steadfastness.” The term is widely used by Palestinian theologians and others to signify Palestinian resistance to the Israeli occupation of Palestinian lands and people. That resistance takes the form of nonviolent advocacy for political change as well as “resistance through existence,” embodied in education, social work, the arts and one’s relationships with the land and community.

This new name – Sumud - re-commits the ELCA to advocacy and awareness-raising grounded in accompaniment of the Palestinian people who are our primary partners in the region, and especially Palestinian Christians, an Indigenous minority community whose ministries of education, health care, social service, justice work, and intellectual and cultural leadership are integral to Palestinian society. Sumud follows the guidance of our Palestinian church partners in updating its name to reflect the truth of the situation on the ground: that only when *justice* prevails in the Holy Land — when the occupation ends and human rights are restored to Palestinians — can there be a true and lasting peace for all Palestinians, Israelis [and everyone in the region and world].

Sumud connects ELCA members to our companions in the Holy Land and seeks to follow the guidance, support the leadership, and amplify the voices of our Palestinian partners. Together with our Lutheran companions, we accompany Palestinians and Israelis, and many other Jews, Christians, and Muslims, in working to establish the justice required for peace.
