"The earth is the LORD's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it." – Psalm 24:1 (NIV)



"So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" – 2 Corinthians 5:17 (NRSV)

The above are two of my favorite verses from the Psalms and the letters of the apostle Paul. In the first verse, the psalmist makes it clear that whatever claim we think we have on this earth, or anything in it, we face the final truth that *everything on the earth that sustains us comes from the God who created us all*. I think of this verse often, as I strive to care for "my" little corner of creation (not that it's mine, of course, but I am responsible for how I use it.)

As we move forward this coming year with the next phase/s of our vision, we begin to focus upon the two remaining "untouched" areas of our 2012 vision statement: "[Becoming a] Campus at the Crossroads" and "Creation Care and Outdoor Ministry." In order to shed light on those areas, Bethlehem will reboot the formerly-known Long Range Planning Committee with new leadership (Phil Anderson) and with a new name ("Bethlehem Visions" – see Phil's piece on the following page). I see much in the way of new ideas and excitement in this endeavor, and for now I will say that there has been movement already in those two vision areas (cases in point, our fall outreach events and what I call "the Slow Greening of Bethlehem")... to be continued on that front.

As far as that second verse from 2 Corinthians chapter 5, when I think of the phrase "in Christ there is a new creation," my thoughts go immediately to two events: The National Youth Gathering a month ago, and Vacation Bible School happening right now. When Alexis, Ally, Courtney, Austin and I returned from the ELCA Youth Gathering in Houston last month, we understood more than ever that when God calls over 30,000 youth and youth leaders together, the theme "This Changes Everything" is no exaggeration. Between our Day of Service, our Synod Day and all the fun (and sacred) moments of worship and hangout time together, we discovered that the Holy Spirit is truly at work in our youth and our church as a whole. In essence, Christ is creating something new when we gather to love, worship and serve neighbor. Perhaps it's as simple as that, my friends.

Jesus is creating something new also with our Vacation Bible School this year as well. From "in-sourcing" our programming and leadership, to revitalizing our "set" (i.e. decorations and props), we are truly focusing on developing new leaders and a new spirit heading into the future – for VBS and elsewhere. We need new leaders, and we hope you consider all that is happening here at Bethlehem, both current and new. Transitions are natural, and leaders are seldom "born": they are called. We hope you prayerfully consider the call to join Bethlehem Visions, one of the committees currently in need of new members (i.e. Y2A, Stewardship, Membership/Evangelism) or other perhaps less-formal opportunities to serve.

WELCOME TO "BETHLEHEM VISIONS"

"Where are we going?" "How long will it take to get there?" "Are we lost?" "Are we there yet?" Questions from the backseat of the car on the family summer vacation? Not this time. They come from the pews of Bethlehem Lutheran Church. It is time once again to get out the map and do some much needed long range planning, or as we now call it, Bethlehem Visions.

Planning is a vital function that involves setting goals and deciding how to best achieve them. Setting goals and developing plans helps our church to move in a focused direction while operating in an efficient and effective manner. Bethlehem Visions is essentially the same as strategic planning; both processes evaluate where the church is today and where it hopes to be at some future point. Strategies or plans are then developed for moving the church closer to its goals. These plans usually pertain to goals that need to be met in two to three years in the future.

People often confuse the role of planning and scheduling. They are different methodologies and utilize a different set of tools. Planning takes a futuristic view and sets anticipated timelines, while scheduling focuses on an organization's day-to-day activities. Our committee will be examining high priority problems that require immediate attention and the resources, both people and financial, necessary to address them.

Your Church Council is still the level of management with the information needed to assess church-wide strengths and weaknesses. In addition, council alone has the authority to allocate resources toward moving the church in new and innovative directions. This means, we serve the Church Council and the members of Bethlehem Lutheran Church.

Strategy implementation is another important part of Bethlehem Visions. Once a strategic plan has been selected, it must be acted upon. This requires the strategy to be implemented within the existing organizational structure, or the modification of the structure so that it is consistent with the strategy. Your Church Council will be given the recommendations of the committee's work and they will determine if and how these recommendations are to be implemented and by whom.

If this kind of work interests you, we still have open chairs. Please contact me and we will make room in the front seat for you. In the meantime, you can look forward to reading more about our progress in future Bethlehem Star's.

Treasurer Update – June 2018 Financial Results

June 2018 numbers show we had a good month, and the same for YTD. June cash flow was positive by \$6,568. We had budgeted June to have a positive cash flow of \$1,432 which means we are ahead \$5,136 from where we thought we would be for the month. It is always difficult to budget exactly when income and expenses will hit. The good June numbers helped us have a YTD positive cash flow of \$15,337.

A key contributor for this good news was the \$6,880 we received in *Close the Budget Gap* funds. You may recall our 2018 budget projected a deficit of \$6,539. The *Close the Budget Gap* initiative was to proactively address the shortage. Receipt of these funds helps make our first six months look very good. It is important we sustain a strong level of giving throughout the year to meet our goal of a balanced budget.

On the expense front we are running under what we budgeted, however this is deceptive. Once you take into account expenses that have been incurred but have not yet hit the books, we are running close to what was budgeted.

Overall, we are on track for a balanced budget by year end.


Council Meeting of July 24, 2018

WORSHIP VOLUNTEERS ARE STILL NEEDED


There are many opportunities for our members to be a part of any of BLC's three services. Some are "in front of the congregation" and many are behind the scenes. With more volunteers on the list for each worship team, the rotation could be every 4 – 6 weeks more or less. We also have music teams that could use your voice or musical skills. Please prayerfully consider joining one of these worship/music teams (training is available for all):

- 1. Altar Guild: Prepares the altar for worship and Communion (one group of two people per weekend)
- **2. Assisting Ministers**: Assists the pastor during the worship service and helps serve Communion (one per each of three services)
- **3. A/V Team**: Sits in the balcony & manages the weekly "Screenouncements" and worship power point presentations (Sat. 5pm/Sun. 11am)
- 4. Lectors: Reads the Scripture lessons at worship services (one per each of three services)
- **5. Hospitality**: Greets people at the door to the Sanctuary, hands out worship folders and collects the offering (groups of two people each for the Sat 5pm and Sun 8:45am services and groups of four people for the Sun 11am service)
- 6. Bell Ringers: Rings the BLC bell in the Gathering Space at the beginning of the service (one per each of three services)
- **7.** *Welcome Table*: Greets people as they enter the church from the parking lot and assists visitors with the layout of the church (coat room, restrooms, nursery, Fellowship Hall, etc) (one or two per each of three services)
- **8.** Worship Assembly and Sanctuary Preparation: Assembles the weekly worship folder and prepares the Sanctuary (one group of two people per weekend)
- *9. Counters*: Counts the weekly offering collection. (Teams of three or four will rotate on a monthly basis)

- **1.** *Adult Choir*: Sings at different services each month. Rehearses weekly, except for summer months.
- 2. Hand Bell Choir: Plays approximately once per month in a Traditional and Modern service. Rehearses weekly, except for summer months.
- **3.** Worship Team: Leads music once a month at the Celebrate! And Modern services. Rehearses weekly, year round.
- **4. Steel Pans**: Plays once a month at various services, mostly during the summer months and Christmas services.
