## The Story of Our Lives



**"24** God rewrote the text of my life when I opened the book of my heart to his eyes. **25** The good people taste your goodness, The whole people taste your health, **26** The true people taste your truth..."

The above verses are from Psalm 18, and a biblical translation (The Message) to which I am really drawn today for a couple reasons. One, our story... being re-written by God when our hearts are open... is a wonderful image. Two, I am thinking of a pop song written in 2013 called "The Story of My Life." It's a song by the band *One Direction*, and it is on the song list for the Verse O.N.T.A.P. outing later this spring. Some of its lyrics begin like this:

"Written in these walls are the stories that I can't explain

I leave my heart open but it stays right here empty for days..."

Now, I can't say that One Direction is a profoundly spiritual band, or that this song is right up there with "A Mighty Fortress..." But I can tell you that its author seems to think that his heart, and the places where he spends his time, are related. I would agree. I also think of the narrative of my own life, and that of those around me, on a fairly consistent basis. You could even say that at Bethlehem we too are writing a story together. Or, more accurately, that God is. The places we gather, and the times we share under one roof (or sky S) together are often profound and life-changing. In this past year alone, I have witnessed how new ministries like The Apprentice Series and the growing, combined effort between Christian Education and Y2A to plan VBS have energized members and allowed hearts to be opened in exciting and new ways.

This coming Lent season (starting in just 2 weeks!) is a time I hope we can all look a little closer at the "story of our lives" together, as we focus on telling the story of how God has led us all to this place, and how our sense of ministry has shaped our lives. *Feel free to pick up a copy of our new Faith Formation booklet in the office soon!*

#### February 2018 STAR Treasurer Update

January 2018 financial results are not yet available as the deadline for February STAR input is January 29<sup>th</sup>. Following are December and year end 2017 results...

December 2017 was certainly a busy month from a financial perspective. Not only did we have the year end crunch of getting bills paid, we had pledging and 2018 budgeting to complete. The 2018 budget was approved. Thanks to all involved from your Church Council to each of the Committees and ultimately to each of you for attending and passing the budget.

For the month of December, our budgeted income was \$38,998 and we received \$36,912...a shortage of \$2,086. Our budgeted expense was \$32,676 and we spent \$30,412...a lower spending level of \$2,264. Two of the primary contributors to the lower spending level were (1) 2017 budget for electricity was set too high, and (2) an invoice for snow removal in December has not yet arrived. Our receipt of \$2,086 less income than expected, coupled with \$2,264 less in expense, gave us a \$178 positive variance against budget. I wish I could say the small variance is due to cracker jack budgeting, but as I've mentioned before, there are many variables involved with the timing of income and expense in a church budget. The ups and downs just happened to balance each other out this month.

For the full 12 months of 2017, our budgeted income was \$393,788 and we received \$381,962... an income shortage of \$11,826. Our budgeted expense was \$393,999 and we spent \$376,199... a YTD reduction in spending of \$17,800.

With YTD actual income received of \$381,962 and actual expense of \$376,199, we ended up \$5,763 in the black for year end. While the income level was lower than hoped, our expenses were even lower which allowed us to end the year on a positive note to the tune of \$5,763. This is great news and thanks to all for your support.

Focus: Evangelical Lutheran Church–Papua New Guinea – Companion Synod with North/West Lower Michigan Synod National Synod Assembly:ELC-PNG, January, 2018

Delegates of the ELC-PNG 31st National Synod arrived at Mogi Kagai Village, East Simbu Province, in the PNG highlands. Despite its location which is quite mountainous and steep for vehicles to climb, people flocked in numbers to witness the week-long event. More than 4000 people arrived early. Tambourine Dancers from the 5 Circuits of East Simbu District performed during the opening ceremony. Head Bishop the Rt. Rev. Jack Urame presided.

Unlike church assemblies in the US, PNG governing officials participated at the closing of the assembly. After the official Closing Worship service, the synod participants awaited the arrival of the Governor General, His excellency Sir Bob Dadae. When he arrived, he was welcomed with a parade by the Police force. Then the Raipingka Trumpet ministry ushered him and his wife Lady Annah into the Synod hall.
