Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The above verse is what I might call a "hinge verse." It connects two of the Apostle Paul's most famous passages: the Body of Christ imagery for life and ministry (12:12-30) and his passage on the nature of love (13:1-13). The first passage states that we are all like organs or pieces of one body, and when (we and) our gifts function in harmony we appreciate one another and what we add to that body. Verse 30 poses the question "Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret?" and verse 31 answers it with the ultimate segway:

"But strive for the greater gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way."

Directly after that verse comes the famous passage we have often heard at weddings, which begins like so: "If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal" and so on.

In these days of clanging cymbals and divisive rhetoric, we in the church are called for "a more excellent way" of bringing the Body together. One such way is a cause I believe we can all team up to address: human trafficking. On page 30 of this month's *Living Lutheran Magazine*, the article entitled "A vital response to human trafficking: ELCA companions in Thailand offer new life for victims," we are confronted with many sobering statistics; but we are also called to help address them.

For example, did you know that an estimated 3 million people each year from Myanmar, Laos, Cambodia and other countries are victims of human trafficking in Thailand? Yet the ELCA and its partner churches are teaming up to provide education for residents in those countries, to help them avoid or escape what our State Department defines as "modern slavery."

And that is just ONE of the "excellent way(s)" we can live in concern and love for our neighbors in the world. At Bethlehem we seek to help the poor and homeless once again this year with Safe Harbor, as well as launching new ministries like THEO (for young adults) this January, hopefully launching a new phase of our vision and mission by year end, and lots of exciting waypoints on the journey in-between. Until then, may your new year be blessed, and may our ministry together be strong and true – to ourselves and the gospel we share.

WORSHIP VOLUNTEERS ARE STILL NEEDED


There are many opportunities for our members to be a part of any of BLC's three services. Some opportunities are "in front of the congregation" and many are behind the scenes. With more volunteers on the list for each volunteer team, the rotation could be every 4 – 6 weeks, more or less. We also have music teams that could use your voice or musical skills. Please prayerfully consider joining one of these worship/music teams (training is available for all):

- Altar Guild: Prepares the altar for worship and Communion (one group of two people per weekend)
- **2. Assisting Ministers**: Assists the pastor during the worship service and helps serve Communion (one per each of three services)
- **3. A/V Team**: Sits in the balcony & manages the weekly "Screenouncements" and worship power point presentations (Sat. 5pm/Sun. 11am)
- **4. Lectors**: Reads the Scripture lessons at worship services (one per each of three services)
- **5. Hospitality**: Greets people at the door to the Sanctuary, hands out worship folders and collects the offering (groups of two people each for the Sat 5pm and Sun 8:45am services and groups of four people for the Sun 11am service)
- **6. Bell Ringers**: Rings the BLC bell in the Gathering Space at the beginning of the service (one per each of three services)
- **7. Welcome Table**: Greets people as they enter the church from the parking lot and assists visitors with the layout of the church (coat room, restrooms, nursery, Fellowship Hall, etc.) (one or two per each of three services)
- **8. Worship Assembly and Sanctuary Preparation**: Assembles the weekly worship folder and prepares the Sanctuary (one group of two people per weekend)
- Counters: Counts the weekly offering collection. (Teams of three or four will rotate on a monthly basis.)
- **10**. **Adult Choir:** Sings at different services each Month. Rehearses weekly, except for in the summer.
- **11. Hand Bell Choir:** Plays approximately once per month in a Traditional and Modern service. Rehearses weekly, except for summer months.
- **12. Worship Team**: Leads music once a month at the Celebrate! And Modern services. Rehearses weekly, year round
- **13. Steel Pans**: Plays once a month at various services, mostly during the summer months and Christmas services
