I Love to Tell.....



I Love to Tell the Story. That's our overarching Lenten theme this year, and of course it's also the title of one of our most beloved hymns (#661 in the ELW "Cherry" Hymnal). When I looked up some of the potential biblical bases for this song, some said it was founded on Psalm 66: 16 or John 15:27. To be honest, however, I thought both of those connections didn't quite connect for me.

Then I found this one from Luke 18:1 : "Then Jesus^[a] told them a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart." –Luke 18:1 Is this not what we do when we tell "the story"? We listen to God's narrative of creation (Genesis), redemption (the Gospels) and sanctification (the Acts of the Apostles and letters to the church) and draw encouragement and hope. Here is the first verse of that famous hymn, in smaller pieces:

- *"I love to tell the story of unseen things above":* While the word "above" might seem a little "otherwordly" and heavenly for our everyday experience, the word "unseen" harkens to that famous text in John's gospel, where the exchange between Jesus and Thomas elicits that famous response to his disciple: "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." (John 20:29 NIV) We believe, as God makes the invisible in our lives, visable.
- "of Jesus and his glory, of Jesus and his love": We spend a lot of time talking about Jesus' love. We should. It is the foundation of the gospel and our Christian faith. Here we can again look to John's gospel (9:10), as Jesus says these poetic and practical words: "If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love." Does this "abiding" remind us of another classic hymn? ^(C) Is not abiding in God's love the same as *living* it?
- *"I love to tell the story, because I know it's true":* Truth is something in our culture that seems increasingly under siege. Subversive stories are made up on social media to divide us, and true accounts that don't fit our desired narrative are often dismissed or called "fake." But with Jesus' story of sacrifice, love and service, we know that we can always point to the gospel for truth and guidance... in a world that needs gospel more and more each day.
- *"it satisfies my longings as nothing else would do.":* One more time in this hymn verse's story we can point to John's version of the gospel, as Christ tells us in chapter 6 (verse 35) that "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty." It is the stuff of great song writing ("Eat this Bread, Drink this Cup...") and the essence of Jesus' message: take in my essence, my life, my love, my words, and once you do... nothing else will do.

One final thought on this hymn, and this theme. You might ask yourself "What difference does a story, or a song, or a worship service make in my life?" There's an old Latin phrase (yup, Latin!) that speaks to how worship together can shape our lives. It is "Lex Orandi, Lex Credendi, Lex Vivendi." And it simply means "As we Worship, So we Believe, So we Live."

I hope you are able to join us each week, and each Wednesday evening, as we eat dinner together, sing together, and share special stories (see box to the right) of a *living* faith and hope!

MARCH STAR TREASURER'S NOTE:

For those that missed the January financial update in the Bulletin...

"We have a good start to the year with January income of \$32,525 and expense of \$28,780. For the month that gives us a positive cash flow of \$3,745. Two of the main contributors were 1) \$1,995 received via the Budget Gap closure initiative begun in December 2017 and 2) our quarterly insurance payment and some snow plowing expense were paid in February. This should catch up to us in February. I am holding off reporting how we are doing against our budget since we are only one month in to the year. We will have a better feel for this after another month of income and expense."

February financial results were not yet available at the time of printing the March STAR.

In last month's STAR I reported our 2017 year end results on a cash basis. To recap, we had income of \$381,962 and expenses of \$376,199, resulting in our ending the year ahead by \$5,763. Cost savings from high staff turnover played a key role in keeping expenses down.

Although we were \$5,763 to the positive as of December 31st, our checkbook balance actually ended the year down \$2,331. The difference is attributable to transfers made throughout the year. The largest transfer was \$5,890 from our general fund checking account to a separate Sustaining Endowment Fund. Over the past couple years \$5,890 has been donated to BLC for the creation of a Sustaining Endowment Fund. The Church Council is currently formalizing the charter of the Sustaining Endowment Fund.

The concept of a Sustaining Endowment Fund is to have a fund with a significant enough balance that interest and earnings would be generated in support of the BLC. I will elaborate more on the fund in a future STAR article.

It is great news that we ended the 2017 year on a positive note and utilized our monies for necessary BLC expenditures.

<u>Church Council Update:</u> Council President, Phil Anderson brought before Council a concern and need that we must address...the concern for a Community Outreach Project for 2018....a one time project, be it a community dinner, lunches for a month for school children whom aren't getting proper meals, the exact project "to be determined". Phil has asked all 13 council members to come to the table at our next meeting, 3/20, with an idea. Please get with one of your council members with your ideas. We want to further show the value of Bethlehem to our community. Whatever community project we do in 2018, if it can touch and help one person or one family, the Bethlehem's Outreach will have been truly blessed.

Keeping The Boardman Clean, Cold And Beautiful

Boardman River Clean Sweep Bethlehem Lutheran Church – Mission Endowment Fund

Background

The Bethlehem Lutheran Church Mission Endowment Fund has been a financial supporter of the Boardman River Clean Sweep several times in the past. Members of the BLC have also done several projects for several years with the BRCS on the Boardman, Betsie and the Upper and Middle Manistee Rivers and also has provided groups of volunteers through their Green Team program to clean up 10 illegal dump sites in Grand Traverse County.

The BRCS works on 19 different rivers. One of the drawbacks of our organization is that we can't get volunteers to do daily and weekly maintenance of all the rivers we clean.

In the past 13 years, the BRCS has fostered 13 new organizations to work on their local rivers. Small local groups have taken on the leadership of the day to day maintenance on the Upper Manistee, Middle Manistee, Upper Platte, Pine, Lower Platte, Sturgeon, Jordan, Maple, Boyne, Bear, Pigeon, Golden Cedar and Betsie Rivers. Instead of them helping us do river cleanups on their rivers, we go out to help them.

This leaves time for us to concentrate on our local Boardman, Platte and Betsie Rivers a bit more.

Last year the BRCS got some limited cooperation from a few of the homeless community and with the City's approval, we have placed four "experimental" trash cans in strategic locations along the river to mitigate the trash that is being tossed into the Boardman in the downtown area. That is an ongoing project but one that we have high hopes for. We have so far removed more than 100 bags of trash from the river banks before it got into the river.

In 2017, the BRCS completed 45 successful projects, the most ever, and removed thousands of pounds of trash from our rivers and woods. Several members of the Bethlehem Lutheran Church attended those events.

In 2017, we successfully completed the first ever cleanup of the Commons and along Kids Creek. We removed 4500 pounds of trash and discarded camping gear from that area. In 2018, we intend to continue this successful project with a 2nd annual event.
