

Taize & Carols Worship Sunday, December 31, 2023 – 10:00 am First Sunday of Christmas

This style of worship comes to us from the Taize Monastic community in France. Founded in 1940 in the midst of World War II, the community sought to be a place of peace and reconciliation. People from all over the world still worship there every day. The Taize style service is one of quiet contemplation and prayer. The songs are simple and are meant to be repetitive. As we sing the songs over and over, they become our prayers, allowing us to focus and quiet our minds and hearts. There will also be times of extended silence throughout the service. While they may seem awkward at first, you are encouraged to spend the time meditating on the Scriptures we read, praying or simply just being still.

A Reading from the book of Isaiah 61:10—62:3

To the people who returned to Jerusalem after the exile, the prophet proclaims that God's salvation will fully come to pass. Jerusalem will become a shining light to the nations and righteousness and praise will spring up as surely as the earth puts forth vegetation.

Galatians 4:4-7


I Am Sure I Shall See

Taken from Bob Goff's book: <u>Live in Grace: Walk in Love</u> <u>A 365 Day Journey</u>

"The story of Christmas tells us a lot about how God rolls. When the angel came to Mary to tell her what would happen, that message did not come with a playbook of everything that would come after. When Joesph learned about his coming son, the angel did not sit him down to explain the miracle or how to navigate the situation. Joseph and Mary were asked to trust, no more and no less. The same goes for the wise men. God showed them a star as a compass, but that was about it.

In our age of on-demand instructions, it is hard to accept the vague sense of direction we get in our spiritual lives. God does not give us the play-by-play of what is to come when He tells us to go. He just reminds us to pack lightly and take a lot of love!

God gave the wise men a direction, not a bunch of instructions. They knew the prophets had said the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem, so they knew He had come when they saw His star hanging just above the place of His birth. They did not hear the voice of God and there were no angels telling them what to do next. They just had a star to point them toward the Savior.

Who we are after Christmas morning says a lot about who we found in the manger. If you find a God who gave up everything to come live with us and die for us so we could finally get a taste of grace, you will want to give that grace to everyone you encounter. It is as if, from a manger in Bethlehem, God leaned over the whole world and said, 'It is your move.' Do not be discouraged just because you do not have all the answers. God is not sending you on a business trip. He is inviting you to join Him on an adventure which will always lead you to Jesus. How will you respond to His calling as we approach this New Year?"

The Gospel: A Reading from St. Luke 2:22–40

Luke's narrative continues with stories that emphasize Jesus' connection to Judaism. His family is devout in its observance of the law, and Jesus himself is recognized as one who will bring glory to Israel.


22 When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, Joseph and Mary brought Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord 23 (as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord"), 24 and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of

the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." 25 Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. 26 It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. 27 Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, 28 Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying, 29 "Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; 30 for my eyes have seen your salvation, 31 which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, 32 a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel." 33 And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. 34 Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, "This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed 35 so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed—and a sword will pierce your own soul too." 36 There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, 37 then as a widow to the age of eightyfour. She never left the temple but worshiped there with fasting and prayer night and day. 38 At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem. 39 When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. 40 The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.


