### Transition, Transition...



What do they say in the realtor's world about "the most important thing" in real estate? ("Location, location, location!") Well, you can say a similar thing about life in the ministry or – more universally, in our journeys of faith together – the most important constant we have is a three-part adage: "Transition, transition, transition."

Yes, I know we all resist change or transition. We cling to the creature comforts of "home," of routine, of stability. Yet everything about the story of God's people speaks the opposite: from humanity leaving the Garden of Eden to seek new understanding amidst our sin (and God's grace); from the Isrealites entering slavery then leaving exile in Egypt; from God's people wandering in the desert, then wondering in the Promised Land; from Jesus' family fleeing to Egypt after he was born, then (2 years later) returning to the Holy Land to grow into the Savior of the nations...only to re-enter Jerusalem for the ultimate transition through death and resurrection into eternity, heaven...and then, someday to return for us all...

All of it is about, you guessed it, transition. We remember these journeys and embark on new beginnings because our faith calls to us, inspires us, nudges us, and sometimes even outright sends us to say goodbye to the "last" things and hello to the "next" things. Goodbye to last year, hello to next. And along the way, we also say goodbye to our wonderful and faithful Music Coordinator, Billie Thompson (at least "officially") this January...Keep alert for the exact time and place of such honoring.

A few words about Billie...Billie is a go-getter, a take-charge person who always tries to "get out ahead" of events, challenges, and joys before they get ahead of us. Personally, I always appreciated Billie's sense of vision and planning. That, of course, and Billie is SO talented musically. From leading the choir years ago, to coordinating all the various musical elements and directors, to pinch-hitting with the creation of Saturday PowerPoint presentations for Celebrate! worship. She has done so much in this community, and she deserves much credit. Please take a moment to give Billie Thompson a big hug, hi-five or other gesture of love and appreciation. Many things at Bethlehem simply would not have happened without her.

So here we are. Transitioning in staff (also into the capable hands of Sharon Weller), a new budget and set of goals and initiatives for 2017, and moving along into the new year as individuals and as a church. What will this year hold? To what scripture can we look to for guidance? The prophet Isaiah perhaps echoed God's abundant (transitional) plans for us in chapter 43, verse 19:

"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?"

That's the first part of verse 19, and it contains a great question (do we recognize the new transitions among us as at least in-part from God?) Sometimes we miss God's call of transformation and healthy change and renewal amid the noise and haste of life. And the next part of verse 19 is just as good: "I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert."

These aren't just poetic words, my friends. They are as true as transition's power over and for us: God gives guidance and sustenance, even in the most bewildering or challenging of years, changes or challenges. May we all embrace the "new thing" God is doing for us all in 2017.

## TREASURER UPDATE

November monthly numbers for the **<u>General Fund</u>** are shown below.

The narrative for November is a good one. Our income for the month was \$31,716 which was \$4,944 greater than what was budgeted. At the same time our expenses of \$29,906 were \$871 less than budgeted. So November was a great month when compared to budget. The budget anticipated a net deficit of \$4,005 and we ended up with a surplus of \$1,810.

Year To Date numbers thru November 30<sup>th</sup> for the **General Fund** are shown below.

Actual Total Income thru November is \$338,710. Budgeted income for this same period was \$339,241 so we are close to budget on Income.

Actual Expense for this same period was \$352,253. Budgeted expense for this same period was \$350,086 so we are running high against budget.

These numbers tell us we are tracking close to what was budgeted for 2016, and the budget anticipated this deficit at the end of November. The 2016 budget was passed with an anticipated year end deficit of \$5,602. December is traditionally a good month with Advent and Christmas income exceeding expense. The 2016 budget estimated December would show a surplus of \$4,202 which will help reduce our 2016 deficit. With continued generous December envelop contributions, the deficit number above can be significantly lowered by year end.

The 2017 budget was passed at the December 11<sup>th</sup> Congregation Meeting. The presentation of the budget explained three key drivers for attaining a balanced budget. Those were...1) Increased giving of \$3,600 (1%), and 2) Increased transfer of \$2,000 from the Challenge Grant from \$4,000 to \$6,000 and 3) a generous gift of stock that will contribute approximately \$4,500 to the General Fund and \$5,000 to mortgage principal reduction.

And lastly, our goal of receiving 100 pledges fell a little short. We ended up matching last year's total of 96. The good news is the average pledge increased from \$2,538 to \$2,585 and the total amount pledged totaled \$248,152. Respectfully submitted, David Peppler

Bradn Buerkle is an ELCA missionary serving in Russia and is helping lead the Equipping for Service Global Ministry Project in Siberia, which is a part of Always Being Made New: The Campaign for the ELCA. Recently, he wrote about a four-day seminar that he helped lead in Perm. Participants in the seminar learned how to live out the Great Commission in their communities.

#### 'Walks with God'

Lexy Johnson is serving as a Young Adults in Global Mission volunteer in Australia and recently wrote a wonderful blog about her morning walks to her work. She reflects on the spiritual practice of walking and praying. She "prays that in the complexities of this world, we may never lose sight of God's presence in and all around us.
