From a pastor's standpoint, November is always a pivotal month, especially at Bethlehem. In the general sense, pastors everywhere see November as the last chance to tighten up their theme/s for Advent, cast the vision for Christmas services and celebrations, and look ahead to the new *church* year (which technically begins the first Sunday of Advent.)

November is also a time of renewal and practical reflection for Bethlehem, and also for me personally. These past few years, I have been participating in a week-long, ongoing program at the Spirit in the Desert renewal center near Phoenix, Arizona during the second full week of November. It is called "Leading Well," and each year I return with helpful tips, strategies and relationships that will help me (and indirectly, us as a church) further our ministries together. Further reflecting in the practical sense, Bethlehem as a whole takes November to recap our Stewardship Campaign (including our pledges for the year), revisit our resources and priorities, finalize our budget for the following fiscal year, and plan to take that annual leap forward into the unknown together once again.

It sounds exciting, right? © For me it always is – no matter what else may be going on in life and in faith. What about you, friends? Do you take the time at a certain part of the year to set aside a proverbial "moment" for extra Sabbath and reflection? Perhaps it seems impractical to do so, and maybe even a tad extravagant. But if we're all being honest with ourselves, life without reflection and rejuvenation is not life to the fullest. In my first semester in college, I remember a college professor quoting Socrates ("The unexamined life is not worth living.") Though I doubt Jesus would phrase it like that, he too practiced reflection with special times of prayer – either away from home, or right there in the thick of it.

Maybe God is calling you this fall to take a few moments, hours, or longer to empty the jar of craziness that all of our minds and hearts become in the course of the year...and let the Spirit in (as Isaiah says above) or for God "to do a new thing."

What will spring forth for you this year?

# President's Corner



President's Corner November 2017

I hope you had a chance to hear Bishop Satterlee's sermon the weekend of October 17th. He preached a powerful message about Stewardship to our congregation. In a conversation with him, he stated that there are several churches that do not have a pastor. He made it clear that we, as a congregation, should support our pastor and value him. That can take the form of financial, as well as, spiritual support. We are blessed with a special man, called of God to be our shepherd. We need make sure he knows how much we appreciate him.

While the Stewardship campaign is officially over and the results are still being evaluated, I will tell you that every one of your dollars is desperately needed for this church to grow in its mission and vision. As your Council President, I am charged with overseeing the business side of Bethlehem Lutheran Church. We are facing a cash shortfall for 2018. Contributions, top line revenues if you will, from 2015 to 2018 (estimated) have declined by 4.7%. That is an unsustainable business model. Our expenses and fixed costs continue to increase year over year. Our best efforts to slash budgets and hold the line on salaries has been exhausted. Simply said, there is no more low hanging fruit. The trend of giving must be reversed in 2018 if we are to remain a viable organization. How much more is needed? By my estimate, if each giving unit at Bethlehem increased their giving by 2% and gave a one-time donation of \$50.00, we would have a balanced budget. Fifty dollars is one tank of gas, or one nice dinner out, or three bottles of wine, or a night out for two at the movies (with popcorn of course), or one oil change for the car, or an Echo Dot (for the techie). You get the picture. My \$50.00 bill is ready. We need yours; each of yours. We cannot "let the other guy" do the heavy

lifting. This is a call to action and I have the faith that each of you will respond, positively.

In the words of Martin Luther:

"I have held many things in my hands, and I have lost them all, but whatever I have placed in God's hands, that I still possess."

# **Treasurer Report**

For the month of October, our budgeted income was \$32,854 and we received \$34,576...an overage of \$1,722. Our budgeted expense was \$32,812 and we spent \$29,100...a reduction in spending of \$3,712. There was a quarterly insurance invoice in the amount of \$1,300 that was not received in October which makes our actual expense understated by that amount. Our receipt of \$1,722 more income than expected coupled with \$3,712 less in expenses gave us a \$5,434 positive variance for October.

For the first ten months of this year (YTD), our budgeted income was \$327,368 and we received \$318,932...an income shortage of \$8,436. Our budgeted expense was \$330,872 and we spent \$315,026...a YTD reduction in spending of \$15,846.

With YTD actual income received of \$318,932 and actual expense of \$315,026, we are \$3,906 in the black for the year. Factoring in the delayed quarterly insurance payment mentioned above, a more accurate number would be \$2,606 (\$3,906 - \$1,300 = \$2,606) in the black as of the end of October.


