SABBATICAL FUNDS: It is so gracious of so many members of Bethlehem Lutheran Church to contribute to the Sabbatical Fund. The Sabbatical Committee is aware there are members who feel very strongly about how they would like to direct their donated funds. Any donations which are not marked will be placed in the general Sabbatical fund. There was a motion made to give Pastor Paul a Sabbatical in the summer of 2023 and it was approved by the Church Council.

The Committee has also reviewed the Sabbatical Policy from the North/West Lower Michigan Synod, which recommends a 3-month Sabbatical every 5 years. According to synod sabbatical recommendations, "although the congregation is not responsible to fund the Pastor's sabbatical activities, parishioners may consider "gifting" as a means of providing financial assistance."
