

<u>The Financial News were inadvertently left out of the July STAR:</u> May income was \$29,705 compared to budgeted income of \$30,645 or a shortfall of \$940. Expenses were \$27,244 compared to budget of \$29,035 resulted in spending \$1,791 less than budgeted. On a cash basis, income exceeded expenses by \$2,461.

Through May, income was \$146,182 compared to budgeted income of \$151,657 for a shortfall of \$5,475. Expenses were \$153,328 compared to budget of \$150,305 resulted in spending \$3,023 more than budgeted. On a cash basis, expenses have exceeded income by \$7,147.
