



Congregational Informational Meeting October 12, 2025 Immediately after Worship Service As most of you are aware we have many issues with water coming into the basement. There was a committee that started working on the water levels from the bay. This problem has gone on for many years. We currently have 2 companies looking at the issues and we are waiting for their proposals. The second problem in the basement is the storm drain, causing more water each time it rains. So there have been several companies trying to find the problem so it can be repaired. Then we have the issues with the infrastructure. We replaced one boiler and looking at repairing or replacing the "old blue". We met with Keen Technology Solutions and have contracted with them to analyze our aging system. In this informational meeting we will have discussions about all of the needs of our building. We will take suggestions of ways to fund all of these projects. Please bring ideas and questions of what you see could be future needs of the church. This is an important meeting to discuss our current and future needs. Please plan on attending.
