
Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,


- 1) **Worship and Ecology:** (God’s cosmos...)

## JANUARY FINANCIAL NEWS

January income was \$35,162.38 against a budgeted income of \$31,982.92 resulting in a \$3,179.46 surplus against budget. Surplus income resulted from annual donations covering 12 months, received in January. Expenses were \$28,212.21 against budgeted expense of \$34,017.84 resulting in expenses being under \$5,805.63. Expenses are lower due to less spending on Fire/HVAC, auditing and Safe Harbor. From a cash flow perspective, income of \$35,162.38 exceeded expense of \$28,212.21 resulting in a surplus of \$6,950.17.



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**Outdoor food pantry update from Linda Hansen:** Our congregation provides food for two different missions: The Baby Pantry and the Outdoor Food Pantry. The needs are very different. This is the focus for the Outdoor Food Pantry: Food or toiletries in individual or small packaging. We have found the needs to be serving sizes of items that are portable. Some examples are:

- tuna fish or chicken pouches (not tuna or chicken salad),
- protein bars, granola bars, trail mix
- crackers or crackers with peanut butter or cheese filling
- plastic fruit or vegetable cups
- ramen, rice or potatoes in the individual serving cups or foil packets
- oatmeal packets, small containers of peanut butter
- jerky/meat sticks, dried soup mixes, dried fruits
- Toiletries/other: toothbrushes, toothpaste, feminine products,
- small first aid kits, toilet paper, wet wipes, glasses wipes
- hand/toe warmers

NO CANS or GLASS containers in the winter months.  
No expired food.

### **Upcoming Event Dates to Keep in Mind!**




